## Of Interest to the Women

### FOLLOW THE RULES IF YOU WOULD IMPROVE ON NATURE'S WORK.

Comparatively few women realize what they can do with rouge. Give themselves color? Naturally that is the first idea. But mould the face so that its actual proportions seem to be changed? Whoever heard of such a thing! Yet that is just what rouge can do.

Remember this—rouge emphasizes the part of the face to which it is applied. That's the secret of face moulding by means of applied color.

Suppose your face is round—moon-shaped—not the delicate oval it ought to have been. Then, in place of putting your color in the exact center of the cheeks and leaving it there, it should be brought up on the cheek-bones, in toward the nose and away from the cheeks and ears. Your face is at once narrower than it was. Then place the bit of rouge on the chin, blending in. Your face has lengthened magically.

To be sure of your effects, try roughing one side and leaving the other untouched. And, by the way, use a cream or a liquid rouge. Either blends better than the dry powdered variety, and your color doesn't rub off during the day as you apply powder.

Now, I'm going to tell those of you who have long faces how to turn the same trick as cleverly as the Parisienne herself would do it.

Remembering that you want to give width to your face apply the rouge further back than any one else would think of puffing it—almost back to the ears. If the way you do your hair shows your ears, put a tiny bit of rouge on them, too.

If your cheek bones are high, as they so often are with this type, see that your rouge goes on not only far back but low down, blending it up and forward and fading it out toward the nose. On no account put the rouge accent on the chin, as the round faced girl must do.

And don't forget to have your rouge and your lipstick accord in tone. Nothing looks worse than purplish-red lips and orange red cheeks.

half inch thick slices, remove the crust, dip the slices into egg mixture. ### CREAM TOAST.

Make a cream sauce as follows: Melt four tablespoons butter in a saucepan; add three tablespoons of flour; stir to a smooth paste; let cook one minute, then dilute with one cup each of scalded milk and thin cream or all cream. Season with salt and dip toast as for milk toast.

### BROWN BREAD TOAST.

Prepare a cream sauce as in the foregoing, using slices of brown bread in place of white bread. First dry the slices of brown bread in the oven, after which toast and serve as milk toast.
