

B. C. Lumber in Saint John.

Saint John Globe-This morning it was said that for the first time, in many months, a cargo of lumber will be brought here next month from Brit. ish Columbia. The lumber, which will be Douglas fir, will be loaded on board the S. S. Grangeport, early in September, and will come consigned to the Robert Reford Company. This lumber which is noted for its length, is consigned to J. A. Likely, and will be used for construction purposes.

#### The Egg Laying Contest.

The birds in the New Brunswick Egg Laying contest last week produced 746 eggs, which is a yield of 53 per cent. A pen of Rhode Island Reds owned by H. G. Harrison of St. John led with 48 eggs, with the Barred Rock pen of Fred H. Ferguson of this city in second place with 47. One of Mr. Fergusons birds has Laid 98 eggs without a break and has only missed one day in 121.
