Liverpool, June 11—Equalling the course record of 70, George Gadd of Rochampton and W. L. Davies of Prenton divided honors for the first 18-hole round of the English Northern pro championship at Formby. Leading an international field of 150, Gadd and Davies assured themselves of a strong position in the qualification test, which will be completed with another 18-hole round. All players within 21 strokes of the leader at the close of the first 36 holes will be eligible to continue on the final two rounds of 18 holes each when a prize of one thousand pounds sterling will go to the low scorer for the complete 72 holes.

"Bill" Mehlhorn of Chicago was third on the list, with an excellent 71, but other invaders did not do so well, the next man from the United States, Cyril Walker, making a 74 to tie eight Britishers for eleventh place.

The bad showing of Walter Hagen pro champion of the United States, astonished the gallery. Hagen's card showed on 82 with three putts on six greens.

"Johnson" Keene started the pitching for Devon and after four hits were made off his delivery in the third inning with one error by Smith netted three runs, he gave up, Burse

going in at the start of the fourth frame.

"Tot" Wheeler was chosen for mound duty by the home team and pitched good ball, although eight hits were made off him they were scattered and not until the fifth and sixth innings was more than one hit in an inning produced. Each team had three fielding errors and there were numerous fielding features on both sides. H. Miles, the Devon third baseman, was "right on" and his catch of Captain's Hall's seeming hit was one of the bright spots of the game. Dougan at second for the Fredericton team also turned in a good game.
