

EXPERIMENTAL
STATION ROAD TO
BE CONSIDERED

Special Meeting of City Council on Tuesday Night—Provincial aid was Requested — Dominion Offers \$10,000.

The question of authorizing a bond-issue for the construction of the permanent road to the Dominion Experimental Station is to come before the City Council on Tuesday night next when a special meeting is to be held for the purpose of considering a variety of business. A telegram from the Federal Department of Agriculture, has been received from Ottawa which states that the Dominion is willing to contribute a total of \$10,000 toward the cost of construction of the road, in two yearly payments of \$5,000 each. Ald. Currier and Ald. Mitchell were in Ottawa some weeks ago as a delegation to wait upon Hon. Mr. Motherwell, Minister of Agriculture, in regard to the matter and the reply from Ottawa is in accordance with what they were led to believe would be offered by the Department of Agriculture.

Waited on Provincial Gov't.
The request for Provincial aid for the road was presented before the Provincial Government Friday. The delegation was composed of Ald. Currier, Ald. Mitchell, Ald. Smith, City Engineer McKay and City Clerk Chestnut. E. C. Atkinson, M. P., accompanied the delegation. Ald. Mitchell was appointed spokesman and presented the request of the city. Consideration was promised.
Legislation Was Withdrawn.
During the last session of the Legislature the Minister of Public Works, Hon. D. A. Stewart, introduced legislation which have enabled the Province to make expenditures within the limits of cities and towns on roads which might be considered part of the Provincial system. Owing to opposition developing the bill was withdrawn.

The city authorities believe that even without such legislation Provincial aid can be given.

Grand Falls Current.
The City Council on Tuesday also will take action toward making application for hydro current from the Grand Falls development to meet the requirements of Fredericton. Hon. C. D. Richards who represents the city in the Provincial Legislature, is interested in that matter.

The Council also is to receive a report from the Roads and Streets Committee, to consider furnishing new supplies to the Fire Department and to authorize a bond-issue for the new pumping unit.

A report has been made against a West End retailer that he has violated the early closing bylaw of the city by keeping his place of business open after 6 p. m. The report is the first of the kind made. The bylaw was adopted by a vote of the City Council on petition from a certain proportion of the retailers engaged in certain lines of business. It is reported that an effort is to be made to bring groceries under the operation of the bylaw.

Late Fred S. Gould.
The funeral of the late Fred S. Gould took place this afternoon from the home of his father-in-law W. J. Kaine of Marysville. The deceased who was a veteran of the Great War died in East Saint John at the County Hospital. He formerly resided in Marysville. Pall-bearers were furnished by the Marysville Branch, G. W. V. A., and interment was made in All Saints' Churchyard. Rev. J. M. Rice conducted the service.
