#### **ALASKA IS GREATEST BIG GAME FIELD**

(New York Herald Tribune.) Alaska is today the white man's greatest big game hunting field in the world, says Governor George A. Parks of Alaska in a report just issued. The big brown bear, which is found only in Alaska is the largesta living carnivorous animal. The dall or white mountain sheep is a truly magnificent animal and certain Alaska moose are giants among moose while the caribou are still found in immense herds, like the bison that once roamed the Western plains. The little Sitka deer is locally plentiful in Southeastern Alaska and mountain goats are common along much of the southern

These animals are of great value to Alaska, both for the meat they produce and attractions to big game hunters, nature lovers and tourists.

All of these animals frequent localities which are easy of access to the non-resident hunters and may be obtained for all localities. Complete outfits and supplies are obtainable in Alaska.

### CONSERVATIVE LEADER SPOKE AT WINNIPEG

Wnnipeg, Man., June 9-Right Hon. Arthur Meighen, Conservative leader and leader of the opposition in the House of Commons, told the Manitoba Conservative Association annual convention last night that adjustments made in the budget within recent days had brought the protection to the automobile industry nearly back to the level at which it had been before the budget was introduced. The removal of the five per cent. luxury ax announced Monday, he said, was equal to increasing the duty on low price cars to 27 per cent. Mr. Meighen spoke for an hour. Of all the deeds of the King administration, its position on the tariff was the most malodorous, he declared.
