Men thoroughly familiar with the present status of the partialpayment plan emphatically dissent from Mr. Babson's alarmist notions They point out that, as a matter of fact, losses on business done on the installment plan by department stores, for example, are almost negligiblesmaller, indeed, than the losses on regular charge accounts.

There is no reason why credit should not be extended to consumers as well as to merchants and manufacturers, provided adequate guaranties are demanded and furnished.
