

F. I. SHERMAN DIED TUESDAY IN ATLANTIC CITY

Fredericton Man Formerly Assistant General Manager Royal Bank of Canada — Funeral Here Friday.

Word has been received of the death at Atlantic City on the 15th inst. of Francis Joseph Sherman a native of Fredericton and a former Assistant General Manager of the Royal Bank of Canada. The deceased at one time was an undergraduate of the University of New Brunswick and was known as a literary man. He entered the service of the Merchants' Bank of Halifax here when the late A. S. Murray was local manager. C. E. Neill now General Manager of the Royal Bank of Canada, was then clerk. The Merchants' Bank of Halifax became the Royal Bank and Messrs. Neill and Sherman were appointed Assistant General Managers at the same time.

Mr. Sherman spent much of his time in the service of the Royal Bank in Havana, Cuba, and had much to do with building up the business of that bank in the West Indies and South America.

Was With C. E. F.

Several years ago Mr. Sherman retired from the service of the bank his health not being good and since that time he resided in Philadelphia and Atlantic City. During the war he served overseas in the accounting branch of the C. E. F.

Surviving Relatives.

The deceased was a son of the late L. R. Sherman of Fredericton. One brother Laurence was killed in France with a battalion of the Royal Fusiliers having enlisted while with the Royal Bank in London, England.

He is survived by a brother Rev. Canon L. Ralph Sherman of Quebec City, and three sisters Miss Myra Sherman of Toronto, Mrs. W. B. Howard of Montreal and Mrs. Dugald Burpee, of Penticton, B. C.

Funeral Here Friday.

The body will be brought to Fredericton for interment. The funeral will take place Friday afternoon with service by Rev. Dean Neales at Christ-church Cathedral at two o'clock Friday afternoon. Interment will be made in Forest Hill Cemetery.

The deceased leaves a widow whom he married in Philadelphia and two children.
