CITY THROGGED TODAY BY BIGGEST CROWD OF FAIR WEEK, EXHIBITION GREAT SUCCESS

Many Maine Motorists Here Today Attracted by Free-for-All of Race Meet—Auto Polo Played Yesterday Proved Great Attraction—Fireworks Display Last Night—Judging in Various Classes Progressing Well.

The city today is thronged by people today. All parts of New Brunswick as well as the State of Maine sent in their contingents. The Americans were attracted particularly by the Free-for-All which was expected to be the contest this afternoon between the mare Guesswork which has been prominent in New England and New York States, and the Aroostook County entries. All in all it looks as if today is to be the big day for the Fredericton Exhibition of 1926 and it follows another big day for the attendance on Tuesday was very gratifying to the management.

Great Crowd on Grounds.

There was a great crowd on the fair grounds last night and early this afternoon the attendance was so great that there was every reason to believe that the place would be filled before evening.

Judging Well Advanced.

The judging in the various classes is proceeding smoothly and the officials are making good time. Yesterday Horses and Cattle received attention from the judges and the Floricultural Section also was judged. The flowers shown this year have produced great praise from experts.

Auto Polo Played.

Tuesday afternoon the spectators of the races saw the first auto polo match played by the two teams. The sport proved a thriller. The upsets frequently encountered by the cars and the manner in which the driver and his mallet-man had to leap to escape injury gave the match all the excitement necessary. At one stage a car was minus a wheel. The British team was announced a winner over the American and the win was gener-

ously applauded. The teams played again at night and will play each afternoon and night for the rest of the week.

Saint Mary's Band Here.

Saint Mary's Band of Saint John arrived this morning to play a two-day engagement. This organization is one of the best in the Province and its ability is well known to Fredericton people. The band played in Regent street this afternoon before marching to the race track. Tonight it will play on the fair grounds. The same band is booked for Thursday.

For Saturday afternoon the greatest thriller of the week will be put on when the auto races will take place on the track. Harry Davies undisputed Middle West Automobile Speed Champion is one of the entries. He will drive an American Flat, 145 h. p. One of his competitors will be Carl King of Brooklyn, N. Y. He has appeared on many Eastern tracks and is a well known driver.

Auto racing never has been seen in Fredericton before. What has passed previously as auto racing was hardly an imitation of what these professional drivers and others will put on next Saturday afternoon.

Ben Branford is another entry for Saturday's race. Branford is a Russian and has had great experience on motor-dromes in the United States and other countries. Those who know motor-racing are expecting Branford to make a showing. He will use an Italian Flat racing car, 135 h. p.
