Six-club League in Ontario Said to be Sure—Western Organization Also on Way.

Hamilton, June 23.—H. P. Thompson, manager of the local arena, is authority for the statement that on Saturday next a meeting will be held probably in Hamilton, to form a minor pro hockey league, and the cities to be represented will be Hamilton, Toronto, London, Niagara Falls, Windsor and either Stratford or Brantford. Mr. Thompson spent some time in the Queen City on Saturday talking over matters with Toronto officials, and he came home quite convinced that there need be no worry over that club. The games, he says, will be played at the Ravina rink there.

According to Mr. Thompson, there will be junior loops both in the east and west, and a playoff for the Canadian title. Out west plans have been laid for a league consisting of Saskatoon, Regina, Moose Jaw, Winnipeg, Calgary and Edmonton. In the east, Stratford is the only doubtful starter at present. The Classic City has always been an O. H. A. stronghold, and some of the club officials do not favor pulling away from the amateur organization, but should they decide to stay in amateur ranks, it is understood that Brantford will jump at the chance to be the sixth club.

The Fredericton Imperials lost a hard fought game last evening on the Marysville field by the score of 4 to 3. Marysville has now a safe lead for the York County League with five wins and no defeats. The Fredericton team is playing true to form having a few bad errors which mean runs, in every game, and last night the breaks were also against them. The team needs more practice and as last night's game showed plainly, they need hits at critical moments to win ball games. The big Marysville inning came in the second session, when the home team netted three runs, two hits in the third, produced the only other Marysville score.

Imps Started Well.

The Imps started away with a bang, McLennahan the first batter singled. Myshrrall sacrificed him to second. He went to third on a wild pitch by White and scored when Dougan singled. Previously Clark was given a base on balls, but the two following batters were easy outs. In the second inning they went out in order, but in every other frame but the last they had runners on bases but could not get the hits to score them.

The Imps came very near tying the score in the last inning, but they fell short one run on a hard decision at the plate on Clark. McLennahan singled to open the inning and went to second on Myshrrall's single. A wild pitch by White gave him third. Myshrrall going to second and both scored on Clark's single to right field. Clark went to second on the throw home. Bailey's overthrow at second sent him

to third. Dougan filed out to Bailey. Clark was called out at the plate on a very close decision when E. MacPherson took McGinnis' slow roller and threw to Bailey, Wheeler hit to H. White who made an out at first. Big Marysville inning.

Marysville scored three runs in the second inning. Hits by Minue, L. White and E. MacPherson, combined with errors by Clark and Dougan and a wild pitch by Wheeler was enough to put the game on ice. The last Marysville run came in the third frame by solid hitting. Cochrane the first batter singled and went to second on a passed ball. Wheeler struck out Minue and Hodgson, and L. White's two bagger scored Cochrane. Page the next Marysville batter struck out.

CALL OF STATES  
STRONG ON FAMILY  
OF MARATHONER

Sydney Mines, N. S., June 23.—John W. Miles Sr., father of "Johnny" Miles of marathon fame, gave out a statement here regarding the reported removal of the Miles family to the United States. Miles Sr., after referring to the family's twenty-year residence in Nova Scotia, said circumstances were such that a removal to the United States seemed advisable, particularly in the interests of the athletic career of his son. A decision was necessary within three weeks, he said, to keep faith with "certain parties in the United States."

Mr. Miles displayed a letter from Hamilton, Ont., asking the runner to sign an agreement to run two years as a professional. "That is the last thing we will do," said Miles Sr. Expressing fine appreciation for the generosity of the Nova Scotia public in financing the runner's activities, Mr. Miles said they could not continue to impose upon the people in that manner. Financial considerations and the welfare of the family as well as the career of the runner all pointed toward the wisdom of a move to the larger centres of the United States, he said.

Johnny Miles himself said it was "all up to dad," who is his trainer and manager. Asked if he would prefer living in Boston, Johnny replied: "No; all things being equal, Sydney Miles is plenty good enough for me."
