### AIR SAFETY.

The man on the street says flying is the safest form of transportation; safer than train riding, automobilism or boating. He can produce carefully gathered and analyzed statistics to prove it. As a matter of fact, he is right; at least, his figures have not been disputed.

But science is not content with safest or safer. Science wants to eliminate the comparatives, and make flying safe; to cut out all danger. Brave men and brainy men are working constantly toward that end. The latest step in that direction has been taken by the United States Navy, at Los Angeles. A Navy officer ascended 2,500 feet in an airplane weighing 1,800 pounds, then stopped the engine, and came to ground, the fall slackened only by means of a parachute, a bag of silk, of 274 square yards. Some of the landing gear was broken, and a blade of the propeller was cracked. That was all the damage. The pilot was unharmed.

A more complete demonstration of the value of the device used cannot be imagined. The force of gravity was opposed and rendered powerless to harm by an agency entirely extraneous from the machine itself. And the scientists tell us to look forward to devices simpler and more effective than the parachute.

### NON-ARRIVALS.

## NOMINATION TODAY IN 27 CONSTITUENCIES

Ottawa, Ont., Aug. 30.—In 27 constituencies the official nominations of candidates for the Federal elections will be held today. The ridings are those which on account of their size or inaccessibility, require more time for the distribution of the ballots and ballot boxes than the week's interval which is provided between nomination and voting day for the rest of the country. The constituencies in which there will be nominations are:

Ontario — Algoma East, Algoma West, Port William, Kenora-Rainy River; Port Arthur-Thunder Bay, Timiskaming North, Timiskaming South.

Quebec — Charlevoix - Saguenay, Gaspé, Pontiac.

Manitoba—Nelson, Selkirk, Springfield, Provencher.

British Columbia—Cariboo, Comox-Alberni, Skeena, West Kootenay, Yale.

Saskatchewan—Melford, North Battleford, Prince Albert, Maple Creek.

Alberta—Athabasca, Peace River, Macleod.

Yukon—Yukon territory.

So far as can be learned there will be no elections by acclamation for the above seats.

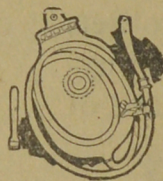
