

### SLEEK-HAIRED SHEIK IS OUSTED BY MOVIES

Hollywood, Calif., Feb. 1—The doom of the vaseline-haired sheik vagrant at filmland's doors and of the girls who dance sans clothing on the beach, together with the whole coterie of hangers-on who have surrounded the gates of filmdom here with a spicy and racy atmosphere that has scented the name of Hollywood throughout the world will be sealed here today by Will Hays. Hays says the industry will be purged, one of the major moves being through the formal opening of the Central Casting Bureau operated by producers.

Good moral character and ability to act will be first references necessary to listing by this free employment bureau which will be the only source of entry to film work. The studios of the Motion Picture Producers and Distributors of America, representing 95 per cent of the industry here, will obtain its extras only through this bureau. All service bureaus and employment agencies and all make-up schools and advertised schemes to prepare aspiring men and women for film work will be wiped out.

The 30,000 aspirants here for extra work will be classified, investigated and segregated. The segregation will list only those qualified and no hope will be held out save to the limit of the number actually required. There are 10 times as many seeking jobs as required.

### CHANNEL ISLES A PARADISE FOR TAXLESS

London, Feb. 1—The Channel Islands lying off the northwest coast of France, known as a tax-evaders' paradise because they are exempt from the income tax, have just decided, after long pressure from the British authorities to make an offer to contribute £300,000 to the cost of the World War.

The islands are the only portion of Normandy which belongs to the British Crown, to which they have remained attached ever since the conquest.

### FARMER SHOT IN GUN FIGHT

Wainfleet Station, Ont., Jan. 30—One man whose name at present is being withheld is dead, and Joseph Palmer, prominent farmer, of Wainfleet Township, is near death as the result of being shot through the neck early Saturday during a battle between two alleged chicken thieves and Mr. Palmer.

### HATS WITHOUT BRIMS CAUSE OF WRINKLES


