FINALLY GOT THERE.

Thus she succeeded finally in placing the responsibility on both parents, instead of on the mother only. And, after several years of argument, most authorities agree that that is just where the responsibility does lie.

The North Shore Leader in reproducing statements made at a recent meeting of the Carleton Branch of the N. B. Canada will be represented at the League of Nations Assembly in Geneva in September by Senator Sir George Foster, Sir Herbert Ames and Hon. Philippe Roy. Sir Henry Drayton, Acting Premier, has announced. Sir George Foster was a member of the Canadian delegation to the first assembly of the League of Nations in 1920, and is President of the Canadian League of Nations Society. Sir Herbert Ames has held the position of financial director of the League of Nations from the institution of that office until his resignation this year.

A few years ago, Japan and Germany were engaged in attempting to destroy each other's culture and material resources. That was war. Today, Germany is shipping to Japan textbooks valued at 5,000,000 marks, this year's war indemnity. The textbooks are to be used in Japanese universities and government departments. They will add to the material resources of Japan and enrich her culture, at a minimum of expense to Germany. Nothing will have been destroyed. The whole transaction is constructive. That is peace.

A tourist edition of the Boston Transcript reproduces a telegram from Saint John, which conveys the information that Marvin Oleott of Corning, N. Y., had taken six salmon in the Restigouche River weighing in the aggregate of 170 pounds. The Restigouche is a leased river and therefore it is difficult to see the wisdom of spending money in boosting it as a mecca for sportsmen. A little effort in the way of making known the angling possibilities of the Saint John and Miramichi Rivers, which are open to the public, would be apt to bring better results.

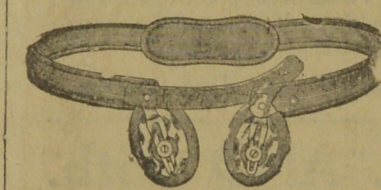
