STEAMED CHERRY PUFFS.

Two eggs, 1-2 cup butter or lard 2 cups flour, 1 cup sweet milk, 1 cup cherries, 2 teaspoonfuls baking powder, 2 teaspoonfuls sugar.

Grease cups, put a few cherries in bottom of cups put batter in and steam 1-2 hour. This serves eight people.

Sauce—1 cup sugar, 2 tablespoonfuls corn starch, 1 cup boiling water lump of butter size of a walnut, flavor to taste.

1 cup rice
1 pound pie cherries
¾ cup syrup
¼ cup milk
1 egg
1 teaspoon butter
1 teaspoon salt

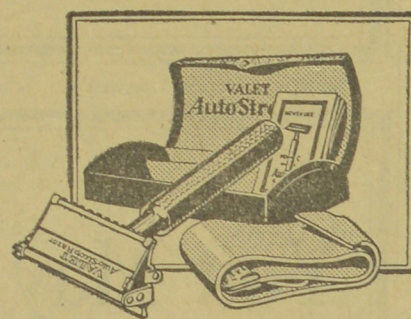
