## KEARNS SUES JACK DEMPSEY FOR LARGE SUM

Claims that as His Share  
as Former Manager  
for Contracts Demp-  
sey Failed to Complete

Saratoga Springs, N. Y., Aug. 18.—A summons in a civil action to recover \$333,333.33 brought by Jack Kearns, Jack Dempsey's former manager, was served on the champion at his training camp at White Sulphur Springs Saratoga Lake. Copy of the complaint was not served, but it was understood that Kearns was seeking to recover for moneys he believed he would have received under contracts he claims to have arranged for Dempsey with Tunney and Wills, provided the champion had carried them out.

Dempsey had nothing to say regarding the action except that when the matter was brought to court he would show that Kearns owed him money rather than he being indebted to his former manager.

Evidently the suit did not make him feel any too good, for he went after his sparring partners without regard for their feelings in the afternoon workouts, going a round each with five of them and battering all of them pretty well excepting Big Bill Tate. Others who stood up against him were Benny Fendor Burke, Joe Kurp, Bill Clemens and Roberto Delino. The last named one of the South Americans in the camp, gave the champion a good workout.

## Wheeler Pitched No Hit Game Against Marysville, Runs Scored on Errors

Imps Beat League Leaders 5 to 2 on Own Ground  
—Fredericton Pitcher Gave Great Exhibition  
—Still Chance for League to be Tied Up.

The Fredericton Imperials went into second place in the League standing of the York County Amateur Baseball League, by defeating Marysville at Marysville by the score of five to two. The Imps outplayed the home team in all stages of the game.

Harry White who started to pitch for Marysville lasted only three innings, the Fredericton team having found him for four hits and five runs. White also was inclined to be wilder than usual. Earle Macpherson pitched the last two singles and held the Imps scoreless for the remainder of the game and allowing them but two singles.

Wheeler in Good Form.

Harry "Tot" Wheeler pitched one of the best games of his career, held Marysville hitless and had it not been for a couple of errors after he hit Amos Macpherson in the fourth frame he would have had a shut-out victory to his credit which he rightly deserved. It was the first no-hit game of the league thus far.

How the Runs Were Scored.

Hersey opened the game by drawing a base on balls. Clark's attempted sacrifice bounced over E. Macpherson's head for a hit. Shannon hit and the sacks were loaded. Myshrrall's sacrifice let Hersey score. Lister's sacrifice scored Clark. Wheeler drew a free pass. B. Cochrane's error of Coyle's drive let Shannon score. E. Macpherson took Hall's grounder and forced Coyle at second for the third out, ending the inning with three Imp runs.

Fredericton went out in order in the second. In the third Shannon the first batter flied out to centrefield. Myshrrall hit. Lister was safe on a choice of the play that was too late

to get Myshrrall at second. Wheeler hit and by fast running Myshrrall scored. Coyle flied out. B. Cochrane's error of Hall's grounder let Lister score. Lifford got a base on balls, and the sacks were full again, but Hersey ended the inning by grounding out second to first.

Earle Macpherson started to pitch in the fourth. Clark flied out as did Shannon in that order. Myshrrall singled but Lister ended the inning by striking out. Wheeler opened the fifth with a single his second of the game in as many times at bat. Coyle forced Wheeler at second. Macpherson making sure struck out Hall and Lifford in that order.

Marysville Presented Runs.

Only nine batters faced Wheeler in three innings, the three in the third frame were all victims by the strike-out route. Also in the fifth Marysville went out in one-two-three order, including a pinch-hitter.

Amos Macpherson the first batter in the fourth frame, was hit by a pitched ball and stole second. Hodgson struck out. Hall's error let E. Macpherson reach first. Lister failed to grab Bailey's hot smash and the Macpherson brothers scored. H. White sacrificed Bailey but the rally was over when Don Cochrane went out to Lister unassisted.
