TO BE IN JUNIOR
HIGH SCHOOL

Morrison School to Lose
One Department —
Preparing for Open-
ing of Schools August
26th.

The schools of Fredericton will open a week from today, August 26th, and the School Board is now making preparations for the new school year. The opening date is nine weeks all but a day from the close of the school in June making an extra long vacation. R. D. Hanson, Supt. of Schools and Secretary of the School Board, is now receiving applications for permits. To date some seventy-five had been issued being about the average number for this time.

New Grade IX.

It is announced that a new Grade IX will be necessary in the Junior High School in which Grades VII and VIII have been conducted heretofore. Miss Kierstead who has taught in the Morrison School will teach the department which will be called a technical class.

Reduction at Morrison School.

The intention now is to reduce the Morrison School from three departments to two. This is on account of a decrease in the number of pupils. The extreme easterly part of Fredericton has been joined to the Lincoln school district and the pupils who formerly attended the Morrison school are being compelled to go to the Lincoln school.

Opportunity School.

The Opportunity School which is a new departure for Fredericton, will be opened in the York Street school with Miss Helen Taylor at teacher. A limit of sixteen pupils is imposed that number being the maximum which it is believed one teacher can instruct as individual attention must be given.

A new Grade VII is likely to be opened in the York Street school as Grade VI in the various schools was large last year.

Repair work has been carried on in the schools. At the Doak School windows were rearranged to give more light.

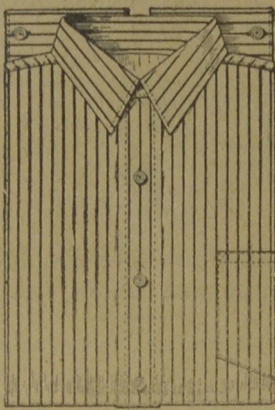
