Opportunity School.

The Opportunity School which is a new departure for Fredericton, will be opened in the York Street school with Miss Helen Taylor at teacher. A Manuel, Hawkshaw, limit of sixteen pupils is imposed that number being the maximum which it is believed one teacher can instruct as individual attention must be given.

A new Grade VII is likely to be opened in the York Street school as Grade VI in the various schools was large last year.
