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CANADA AND THE U. S.

Mr. Arthur Brisbane, who is said to be the world's highest paid editorial writer, in the course of a recent article on Canadian affairs in the Boston American has this to say:

"Mackenzie King, Canadian Premier, says truly that all talk of Canadian annexation by the United States is foolish. It's as foolish as to talk about Canada annexing this country. But Canada and the United States, ruling and owning these northern lands, should be closely united in business, as well as close friends.

"Americans would welcome a working arrangement by which the free trade between our forty-eight States could be extended to include Canada. That would give Canada the advantage of quantity production in the United States, which she cannot get for herself for a long time to come.

"First of all would come uniformity in tariff. There is no difficulty that could not be arranged to the advantage of both countries.

"In this country there is no more desire to own Canada than there is in Canada to own the United States. It is an excellent thing for us to have so able a peace-maker on the North."

If our American neighbors are anxious to do business with Canada they might start in by repealing the Fordney-McCumber tariff, which would provide an opportunity for the exchange of natural products.

WILL VOTE ON PROHIBITION

Albany, N. Y., Oct. 23—The electors of the state will be requested to vote on the prohibition referendum in accordance with an act of the last legislature of election day. The court of appeals yesterday affirmed decisions of the lower court which refused to grant an order against the New York City board of elections requiring them to omit the referendum from the ballot.

Application Refused.

Hon. H. A. McKeown, chief commissioner, Board of Railway Commission for Canada, has informed the board of trade in an official bulletin, that the Commission has refused the application of the board of management, Parish of Lancaster, for an order to compel the Dominion Express Company and the Canadian National Express Company to extend their free wagon delivery into the parish. The hearing took place here in April last and was opposed by the Express Traffic Association of Canada.

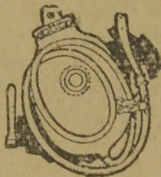
