

R.B. HANSON CASE
BEFORE APPEAL
COURT TUESDAY

W. P. Jones, K. C., Retained by Barristers' Society — Counsel to Show Cause — Small Docket.

R. B. HANSON and 6, 6606001 ... The Supreme Court of New Brunswick, Appeal Division, will meet on Tuesday next with a brief docket, four cases in the King's Bench Division and one in the Chancery Division.

In addition to the regular docket there will be the hearing in the case of R. B. Hanson, K. C., M. P., against whom the Council of the Barristers' Society found in charges of unprofessional conduct and recommended to the Supreme Court that penalty be imposed. Hearing in this matter will follow immediately after common motions and probably will come the first day. W. P. Jones, K. C. has been retained to represent the Barristers' Society. Counsel will show cause for Mr. Hanson.

King's Bench Division.

1. Long, an infant by next friend, et al, vs McLaughlin et al. G. H. V. Belyea, K. C., for defendants, to move to set aside verdict for plaintiffs and enter verdict for defendants, or for new trial, or for the reduction of the verdict.

2. The same vs The same. W. R. Scott for the plaintiffs to support cross appeal.

3. Palatine Insurance Co. vs Begin et al. J. H. A. L. Fairweather and F. H. Taylor, K. C., for plaintiff, to move to set aside verdict for the defendants and to enter verdict for plaintiff, or for new trial.

4. Village of Rothesay vs Thomson. H. A. Porter and F. R. Taylor, K. C. for defendant to move to enter verdict for the defendant, with costs, or for a new trial.

Chancery Division.

1. South Branch Fishing Club vs Linton. G. H. V. Bridges, K. C., for the defendant, to support appeal from the judgment of Mr. Justice Grimmer.

Locally the game had attracted keen interest as means of comparing Acadia with University of N. B.

Chancery Court Finished Case.

Before the Chancery Court, Chief Justice Sir Douglas Hazen presiding, argument was completed yesterday afternoon before court rose, in the suit of Lipsett and Bailey, administrators, vs Howard A. True, P. J. Hughes, K. C., appeared for plaintiffs and J. B. McNair for defendants. The suit concerns a farm property in Lincoln valued at \$6,000. The plaintiff alleges that the defendant holds the farm only in trust.

EXHIBITION
DIRECTORS ARE
PREPARING

Organization of Committees and Departments for 1926 Fair Completed—Will Ask for City Grant.

The Fredericton Exhibition of 1926 is on its way. Organization meetings were held last night by the directors when committees were named and departments organized. A delegation was named to appear before the City Council and ask for a grant from the city similar to that given in 1925 when \$1,500 of a grant was used.

Hon. Lewis Smith, Minister of Agriculture, when approached with regard to a Provincial Grant intimated that it was his opinion that Fredericton should contribute as much to the fair as did the Province.

Honorary Presidents.

Hon. Lewis Smith, and Hon. C. D. Richards, Minister of Lands and Mines were elected Honorary Presidents for 1926. The permanent Honorary President is John A. Campbell.

Matter of Grants.

Reports were presented by the delegations which had appeared before Hon. Mr. Smith and before Dr. Grisdale, Federal Deputy Minister, in the matter of grants. It was stated that Dr. Grisdale had been particularly impressed with the exhibition and had expressed the opinion that Class A grants should be permanent instead of alternating with Class B grants.

In applying for the grants it was pointed out that Fredericton Exhibition in prize-money gave much more than the aggregate of the grants. A change in policy in regard to livestock was outlined it being intended to give more prizes for New Brunswick bred stock and less for classes for the professional livestock men.

C. D. Holder and D. W. Griffiths were authorized to attend the meeting of the New Brunswick & Maine Circuit at Woodstock, February 22nd. W. S. Hooper will also attend as vice-president of the Circuit.

THE U.N.B. CON
ATTRACTS MANY
TO CITY TODAY

Guests From Outside Fredericton Arrive in Large Numbers—The Event of College Social Season.

The big event of the social season at the University of New Brunswick, the annual Conversation or "The Con" as it has been known from time immemorial, takes place tonight. Preparations are receiving the finishing touches from the eleventh-hour "greening" and other decorating this afternoon, to the shovelling out of University Avenue by a city crew to permit sleighs and cars to reach the Arts Building.

The Memorial Building is not being used the "con" being held as usual in the Arts Building the main hall of which will be for dancing. Entrance is to be by the west door. Supper is to be served in the library. The dance program is to be of eighteen numbers with three supper extras.

Many Guests Here Now.

Many guests are here now having arrived last night and this morning. Others are expected this afternoon and tonight. G. Byron Carr is secretary of the "con" and the acceptances received by him indicate an attendance of several hundred people many of whom will be from outside Fredericton.

Scheme of Decorations.

The mathematics class room is decorated as an athletic room with the various cups won by the university teams on exhibition, and red and black the color scheme. The "old chapel" is decorated as a Garden Scene at Night with arbors and other arrangements. The English and Classical class rooms are used as dressing rooms. The various classes had charge of the decoration in different parts of the building. The Juniors decorated the Ladies room and the centre hall and the Seniors the Library. The lower classes had other rooms. Different color schemes were used in different parts of the building.

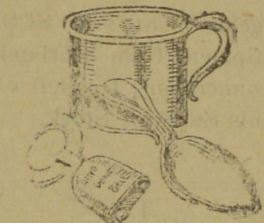
