DIRECTORS ARE
MEETING TODAY

Local Fair Dates Sep-
tember 17th to 24th—
Good Position in Cir-
cuit — Officers Being
Elected.

The next step toward the Frederic-
ton Exhibition of 1927 is being taken
this afternoon when the directors of
Agricultural Society No. 34 are meet-
ing to elect officers and appoint com-
mittees for the ensuing year.

Place in Circuit.
The dates of the next Exhibition
are September 17th to 24th a change
having been made from the dates ori-
ginally selected. The time of the
month will be about the same as last
year. The dates selected will bring the
local fair into the circuit after St.
Stephen and Woodstock which have
the same week and before Chatham
and Charlottetown which also have
the same week. With no exhibition
competing there should be extra large
exhibits in all classes. Saint John will
be the earliest exhibition in New
Brunswick during the week of Labor
Day. The expectation now is that
the Nova Scotia Provincial Exhibi-
tion will be before Saint John, in the
latter part of August.

Changes May be Made.
It was expected that changes might
be made among the officers. President
Alonso Staples had expressed a wish
to be relieved of the duties of the
office. H. A. Smith and G. H. Clark
have been mentioned in connection
with the presidency.
There is every expectation that the
Exhibition will be as successful as in
the past and work in that connection
already has been begun.

NOW OF BEST

Cold Weather and Snow
Excellent — Lath Out-
put Will be Heavy —
Christmas Exodus to
Start Soon.

With the logging season nearing the
close of its first lap in New Brunswick
conditions are generally reported ex-
cellent. The fall of snow has been
enough to making the roads fairly
good and the weather has been cold
enough to close the swamps but not
too cold. Hauling will not take place
until after the New Year as a gen-
eral thing and by that time the quan-
tity of snow will be enough for any-
thing less unseasonable weather con-
ditions occur.

The south of the Province at the
present time seems to have the great-
er depth of snow although the north
got the snow first. In the central por-
tion there is no great depth of snow.

Lath Popular Line.
Lath are a popular line of manufac-
ture in lumber this winter. The Ameri-
can price although not remarkably
high is considered fair and the de-
mand steady. A large number of small
mills are at work on lath, as well as
the larger plants.

Out of the Woods from Christmas.

The custom which has become gen-
eral in recent years of leaving the
lumber woods for Christmas will be
followed. The end of next week will
see some of the crews leaving the
operations and Christmas week will
see all but the most remote camps
practically deserted. The crews will
return again in early January.
