

MOOSE FROM

Chief Game Warden Gagnon has Returned From New York — Committee on Boston Show Meeting Today.

A quarter of moose from New Brunswick donated by W. H. Allen, president of the N. B. Guides' Association, and taken to New York and presented to the American Fish & Game Protective Association by Chief Game Warden L. A. Gagnon, was one of the chief items of the bill of fare of the banquet which featured the thirteenth annual meeting of the Association at the Hotel Pennsylvania. The Chief Game Warden has returned from New York and reports the meeting of the Association very successful.

All States of the Union and four Province of Canada were represented. Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick were the Provinces the Chief Game Warden being the only New Brunswick representative.

Greatly Appreciated.

The films of salmon fishing on the Restigouche which were taken last summer were shown by Mr. Gagnon. The Association greatly appreciated them and also the quarter of moose which was donated. A standing vote of thanks was given.

Boston Sportsmen's Show.

The provincial committee named to act in connection with making an exhibit at the Boston Sportsmen's Show met here this afternoon. The advertisements issued by the Chief Game Warden, asking for live game animals have produced results. It is believed that specimens of everything but moose can be obtained now. There will be difficulty in regard to getting a moose.

For many years he represented the Parish of Douglas in the Municipal Contest and was once a candidate for the Legislature on the Progressive ticket.

Last summer he was employed for a time in one of the Scott pulpwood camps near the Hanwell. The act of arson of which Hallett is accused occurred last spring at Three Tree Creek, Sunbury County, some three miles from Fredericton Junction.

FULL TICKET  
OF ALDERMEN  
ORGANIZING

Monday Next the Last Day to Qualify—New Ticket Will Not Include the Present Aldermen.

It was announced today that organization had been begun with the object of placing in the field a full aldermanic ticket for the five vacancies which will exist with the close of the year and the completion of the two-year term by an alderman in each ward of the city. It was said also that the ticket would not include aldermen of the present City Council whose terms have been about completed.

A mayoralty candidate also is expected to run with the ticket behind which are the same elements which succeeded in electing a full ticket in January last. His Worship Mayor Clark is not in the city today and his intentions are not known. Many would like to see him a candidate again.

Ald. Mitchell to be Away.

Ald. Moses Mitchell who had much to do with organizing a year ago and electing a ticket of which he was a member will be out of Fredericton for the greater part of December his business as a contractor calling him to Edmundston. It is expected that he will return before nominations close on the first Monday of January.

The aldermen whose terms of office expire with the year are, Wellington Ward, Ald. W. K. Hay; St. Ann's Ward, Ald. H. A. Smith; Carleton Ward, Ald. D. W. Ross; Queen's Ward, Ald. Ivan McKnight. Ald. Smith and Ald. McKnight have expressed a desire to retire from civic politics.

Other Nominations Likely.

It is probably that there will be nominations in opposition to the ticket which is rumored.

The period for qualifying as a voter by the payment of taxes will close on Monday next. So far there has been no great rush to pay taxes.

HOME ENTERS INTO  
STAIRS CASE

Arrangements made Today to Remove Grandmother and Two Children From Southampton Junction to Home.

This morning George Sinnott and his sister Mrs. Clara Stairs wife of Benjamin Stairs of Hartfield, who were arrested at Southampton Junction on the complaint of the husband who alleged incest, were given a remand until Tuesday by Police Magistrate Walter Limerick. The accused were not represented by counsel. The informant appeared but had no counsel. Others who were to be witnesses also appeared.

Removing to Home.

The remand was made chiefly for the purpose of permitting the authorities of Southampton Parish to arrange for the admission of the mother of the two accused and her two grandchildren, children of Mrs. Stairs to be admitted to the Municipal Home at Douglas. They and the two accused have been living for some time in a board and tar-paper shack on land of the Nashwaak Pulp & Paper Co. at Southampton Junction. The living conditions are wretched and the desire is to get rid of the shack the occupants being squatters on the property.

This morning officials from Southampton were in the city and made the necessary arrangements.

Mrs. Stairs who is considerably younger than her husband has refused since her arrest to return and live with her husband alleging ill treatment. She left him some time ago.
