

### CONDITION OF TWO VICTIMS IS SERIOUS

#### Donald Slipp and Miss Adeline Mooers Severely Hurt Motoring—Wallace McAdam is Improving.

"In very serious condition", was the statement issued officially from Victoria Public Hospital this morning concerning Donald Slipp of this city second son of Hon. A. R. Slipp, and Miss Adeline Mooers daughter of Fred S. Mooers of Woodstock victims of Saturday night's motoring accident at Burden Bridge about twenty-two miles west of Fredericton on the Fredericton-Woodstock highway. Wallace McAdam of this city son of J. A. McAdam was reported by the hospital to be holding his own and possibly showing signs of improvement but worrying about the accident as he recovers from the shock.

#### One Returned to Woodstock.

Edward Roberts the fourth member of the unfortunate party was able to return to Woodstock Sunday night. He had a severely wrenched arm and other injuries but did not enter hospital.

#### Car is Smashed.

The car belonging to Mr. McAdam which was in the accident was brought here. The front is driven in as the result of the thirty-five foot drop into the gully.

Many visited the scene of the accident on Sunday. The posts along the right side of the bridge were smashed off in succession by the car as it swerved to plunge over the side.

#### Fatality at Same Place.

The spot is the same as that at which Mrs. James W. McGuire of this city lost her life several years ago in a similar accident.

#### Steering Gear Went Wrong.

Mr. Roberts the least injured of the four in the car stated that as they approached the bridge with Mr. McAdam driving he heard something snap and then saw the steering-wheel turn around in the hands of the driver with no effect on the car's direction. The car then went over the side of the bridge.

#### Ambulance Despatched.

Dr. McKenzie of Prince William rendered assistance to the injured party and the Victoria Hospital Ambulance was despatched. Dr. A. F. VanWart also went to the scene and others rendered aid. Reports which greatly exaggerated the accident at once became current. The injury to Mr. Slipp and Miss Mooers is so serious, however, that their friends entertain the gravest anxiety. Spinal injuries are feared and it will be some days before a definite statement can be made. The injury to Mr. Slipp's back is just below his shoulders. Mr. McAdam sustained severe cuts about the face and neck with other injuries.

### LIGHTNING BURNED OUT MAIN SWITCHBOARD

#### Maritime Electric Co., Plant Affected Twice in Twenty-four Hours by Heavy Storms.

The heaviest electrical disturbance experienced in several years occurred on Sunday and early this morning. Twice within twenty-four hours the plant of The Maritime Electric Company was put out of commission. Between noon and one o'clock Sunday afternoon a heavy discharge which struck somewhere in the city entered the electric plant and burned out the main switchboard. It also burned out the fuses in all transformers in the eastern part of the city. Service was resumed in about half an hour.

Early this morning another electrical storm occurred and additional trouble occurred at the electric station it again being necessary to suspend operations for a time.

#### Heavy Rain Elsewhere.

The storms were heavy in other sections of the Province also. The Southwest Miramichi received a

This afternoon the hospital reported that he had sustained injuries about the head and also to his left arm and shoulder where a dislocation may have occurred. His condition is classed as quite serious. He was conscious when taken into hospital.
