## suspicion an old-fashioned mother ARECEIPT FOR A NOTED FRENCH DISH

Paris, Oct. 18-Here is the recipe for "Pot au Feu," which is the favorite dish in France, the land more celebrated than any other for its cookery:

Tie a string tightly about two pounds of beef and place it in a saucepan containing 10½ pints of cold water. Add a good handful of mutton may also be added to improve the flavor of the broth.



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
