TARGET GOLF TO BE ADDED ON ENGLISH COURSE

Moor Park to Have Additional Hazard—Reward for Shot to the Pin.

TARGET GOLF and WDK yakVv ... London, April 26—Arithmetical hazards will be added to golf by a novel point scoring to be introduced in The Evening Standard's tournament at Moor Park in June. An attempt will be made to reward that most important shot of high-class golf—the shot to the pin.

"Target golf" will be played as ordinary medal rounds, but the greens will be marked with three white circles at intervals of about fifteen yards, with the cup as the centre of the bull's-eye.

Each circle will have a point value, depending on the yardage of the hole. For instance, on short holes a tee shot alighting in the inside circle will count nine points; in the middle, eight; and in the outside circle, seven. Holing putts from the outside circle, seven. Holing putts from the outside circle will count more than shorter putts, provided the player has come through the fairway properly.

SUZANNE CONFIDENT OF BEATING HELEN

French Star Talks of Beating Miss Wills Twice Before Leaving for United States.

New York, April 26—Mlle. Suzanne Lenglen will invade the United States in July to take the leading role in a motion picture and play a series of exhibition tennis matches. Charles C. Pyle announced after a conference with his representative, William H. Pickens, upon the latter's arrival from Europe.

Pyle, manager of Red Grange said the French star already has signed articles for the film which will probably be based upon her book, "The Love Game." Pyle met Pickens in New York and announced he would accompany the latter back to Europe in June to discuss Mlle. Lenglen's itinerary in this country.

In a talk with the French star a few days prior to his departure for this country, Pickens said Mlle. Lenglen has assured him she expected to play Helen Wills, United States champion, at least twice before her departure for this country. The matches, he said would be in the French and Wimbledon championships, provided the two players became finalists.

There is absolutely no doubt in Mlle. Lenglen's mind that she can repeat her initial triumph over Miss Wills," said Pickens. "She indicated to me that she could see no possibility of defeat."

FAMOUS YALE ATHLETE PASSES

New Haven, April 26—The executive committee of the board of control of Yale athletics has passed the following resolution on the death of A. B. Cox, Yale '87 famous track athlete:

"The death of Alexander Brown Cox of the Yale College class of 1887, closes an unusually long and noteworthy connection with Yale athletic interests. An undergraduate he was for four years a prominent member of the track team, and for two years its captain. In sophomore year he was also a member of the university football eleven.

"In the early years of the Mott Haven track athletic games he was an outstanding leader both in individual and team contests. His interest in athletics continued unbroken.

"At the time of his death he was a member of the Yale graduate committee on track athletics, of which he had served continuously since its inauguration a decade ago under the present system of athletic control.

GLENN COLLETT NOW IN ENGLAND

Southampton, Eng., April 26—Glenna Collett, American woman gold champion, arrived here confident but modest as to the prospects of her invasion of the British links. "I shall do my best; no one can do more," she said.

She believes the American golfers visiting England will have difficulty in adapting themselves to the different playing conditions here.

She expects to be in and near London for seven weeks, after which she will proceed to Harlech, Wales, with four other American women golfers, to compete in the British women's open championship tournament.

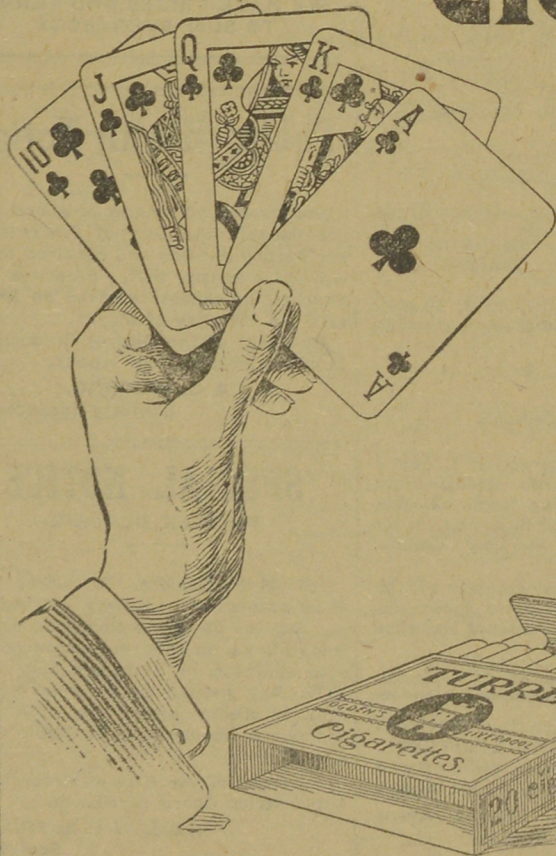
