W. W. Donohoe Winner of Williams Taylor Medal

Ed. Goodspeed Second Among Point-winners with Thirteen—Donohoe Made Nineteen and Total of Twenty-nine for the Medal — Paul Fraser Had Total of Twenty—Fredericton High Cleaned Up School Events.

In a drizzling rain the annual track and field events of the University of New Brunswick were held Tuesday afternoon at the College Field. The records were hardly closely approached which was not surprising under the weather conditions, not only of the day but also of the training season, as it is little more than a fortnight since the snow and ice left.

Williams Taylor Medal.
The chief interest in the meet centered about the individual showing of the contestants standing high in the competition for the Sir Frederic Williams Taylor Medal for general proficiency in athletics. W. W. Donohoe of Saint John proved the winner. Paul Fraser also of Saint John entered the competition the best qualified having fifteen points from participation in rugby football basketball and hockey. Chip Seely and Donohoe each held ten points for rugby and basketball. Donohoe was the only serious contender in the meet as far as the medal was concerned adding nineteen points for a total of twenty-nine. Fraser added five making a total of twenty.

Point Winners in Meet.
In the track and field meet Donohoe was high point-winner but Ed Goodspeed with thirteen points was second and under better weather conditions would have made a

better showing. His athletic performances should improve as time goes on.
In the school events Fredericton High School cleaned up everything, Provincial Normal School being the only other competitor.

The scoring of the competitors in the university events on a basis of three, two and one for first, second and third positions was as follows:

FASTEST MILE IN NORTH 2.13 1-2 AT GOSHEN, N. Y.

Aroostook Trainers to Start Jogging This Week — Horses in Northern Maine Look ing Good.

The fastest training mile by trotter over a Northern track this Spring, so far as known is the 2.13 1/2 worked by "Bud" Murray's Peter Scott gelding, Peter Burt, 2.25 1/4 over the mile course at Goshen, N. Y., last Friday.

This, however does not mean that the Orange County trotters are all so much advanced in the preparation for the stake candidates of Walter Cox, Will Dickerson, Will Leese, Fred Hyde, Jimmy Small, Watt Cleveland, Bert Long, Ed Kirby and Townsend Ackerman are still a workout or two away from 2.20.

The black son of Peter Scott 2.05 and Tootsie, 2.19 was raced this past Winter in Bermuda and has never been let down and is quite likely up to a mile in 2.10 if his Chester owner-trainer cared to move him that fast.

The loss to T. W. Murphy in the fire at the Macon, Ga., fair grounds was not so large as at first reported. He lost several hundred dollars worth of hay and feed and a small amount of training equipment. The buildings destroyed however, were valued at \$35,000.
