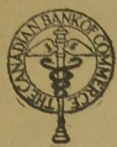

R. C. CHURCH AND MONASTRY DESTROYED

Campbellton, June 20—The Roman Catholic church and monastery at St. Anne de Restigouche, across the river from Campbellton, were totally destroyed by fire yesterday afternoon. The loss is estimated at nearly \$100,000. The fire broke out about 3 o'clock and the fire protection equipment of the Chaleur Bay mills was put into action at once. The fire department here was also asked for help and a detachment of firemen with fire engine and other equipment were rushed to the ferry and taken to the scene of the blaze.

A high wind, similar to that of the day previous during the conflagration at Matapedia, swept the flames and had it not been for the effective work of the local brigade and the mill crew many nearby residences would have been destroyed. The fire also caught in one corner of the mill yards but was extinguished before it had made much progress.

Was Stone Church.

The loss of the fine church at St. Anne de Restigouche is a severe setback to that community. The building was a splendid stone structure which was only completed last summer.

FISHES' FINGER TIPS? YES, THEY HAVE THEM

Cleveland, June 18—Fish have finger tips. The Cleveland Museum of Natural History will argue genially with anyone about the matter.

"The finger of a fish," said the museum's latest bulletin, "are strung all along the side of its body, from the head to the end of its tail in what is called the lateral line. If it is objected that a fish has no finger tips it can at least be said that their functional equivalents—the parts of most sensitive skin sense—are those organs of the lateral line. The position of this line is indicated very clearly in the little fish, Xiphophorus helleri or Mexican swordtail. In the swordtail there is a pigment stripe of bright red which coincides with the lateral line. In most fishes the lateral line is scarcely discernable.

"In this line, which is really a tube or a groove in most cases, are a series of tactile sense organs composed of a number of nerve cells which receive and communicate external stimuli of a mechanical sort. Fishes have other skin-sense organs but those in the lateral line as those in our fingers are most efficient.

ORGANDIE WITH CROCHET.

Imagine an organdie-trimmed sport frock; The material hardly seems appropriate for a vigorous outdoor career yet it is among the novelties offered and one which will appeal to the veranda variety of folk.

Taffeta, wisecracks tell us is responsible for the re-entry of organdie the two materials having an old and socially recognized affinity. There is a great deal in common in their crispness, a sort of impersonal quality delightful when the thermometer registers at so high a pitch that proximity even of one's apparel is an irritation. Inconsistencies are often delightful so when a designer cleverly combines silk or even wool crochet trimming has been established for some time especially for crepe de chine still the most popular of all silks for sports wear although there are georgette sports things and some satin faced crepes rajahs and novelties which deserve polite consideration.

Crepe de chine has the steadfast quality of an old friend and may be relied on with certainty. Bols de rose all flesh coral and geranium shades and beige, almond greens and poudre blues offer great variety and effectiveness. One wonders sometimes in looking about what has happened to the vogue of gray which so many predicted. Beige is apparently quite self effacing enough for those who demand neutrality in background so their accessories may be the more striking in color.

Oatmeal Molasses Pudding.

One and one half cups cooked oats, 1 1-2 cups scalded milk, 1 cup molasses, 2 eggs, 1-2 tsp. cinnamon 1-2 tsp. allspice, 1 cup chopped raisins, dates or figs. Cold or fresh cooked oatmeal may be used. Mix the milk with the oatmeal and when free from lumps add the beaten eggs, molasses, spices and raisins. Pour into a greased baking dish and bake in a slow oven—300 degrees—about 40 minutes or until firm. Serve hot or cold, plain or with milk or cream.

Chicken Pudding En Casserole.

Stew 2 chickens until tender remove from liquor and place in casserole. Sift 2 cups of flour with 1 tsp. salt and 1-2 tsp. pepper add gradually 3 well beaten eggs 1 cup of milk and 2 tsp. melted butter. Mix and beat until smooth cover chicken and bake for an hour. Serve with Mexican rice. (This is rice cooked in the chicken liquor to which chopped green peppers tomatoes and minced onion has been added. May be covered with buttered bread crumbs and baked in a ramekin).

Quick Mayonnalse.

Take 2 well beaten eggs 1-2 cup vinegar, 1-2 tsp. salt, 4 tsp. sugar mix and bring to a boil. Now mix 3 tsp. flour to a smooth paste with water, add 1-2 cup milk and stir into the boiling mixture. Boil until thick.

Spice Cake.

Take 1 cup sugar, 1-2 cup shortening, 1 cup sour milk, 1 cup raisins 2 cups flour, 1 tsp. each of soda cinnamon and nutmeg and 1-2 tsp. of cloves.

ANCIENT CITY OF DAMASCUS IS AGAIN BEING BATTLE TORN

Jerusalem, June 22—The Nationalist Syrian Ministry at Damascus has resigned and a new Cabinet is being formed by Ahmed Nami Bey as Premier as a consequence of the Government's inability to pacify the country settle the Druse war and raise the siege of Damascus.

When M. Jouvenal the French High Commissioner appointed the Ministry he accepted their conditions for Syrian peace provided the Ministry itself succeeded in ending all hostilities by June 15.

Since hostilities have not been stopped the projected amnesty probably will be delayed until a consultation is held in Paris which is particularly difficult to arrange just now on account of the political and financial crises in France whose settlement must precede any permanent effective policy here.

It is everywhere predicted in Syria that M. Jouvenal will not return. It is considered that his civilian policy failed despite his high personal tact and character and since the Syrians themselves are quite unable to pacify the country no final government policy of any kind can be undertaken successfully until military measures definitely prove that France seriously intends to stamp out insurrection for good and all by the force of arms.

The first troops from Morocco are expected to arrive at Beirut on Thursday. Two divisions comprise the first installment. The troops

are Colonials and not native French.

Unfortunate incidents marked the week in Damascus in view of the fact that amnesty should have been declared on Tuesday. A band of almost a thousand rebels managed to gain entrance to the city between the Batouma and Babsharki gates despite the French entrenchments and were repulsed only after bloody fighting and heavy bombardment lasting six hours. The battle left its inevitable train of fiendish atrocities on the peaceable inhabitants of those quarters of Damascus—whether by Circassian soldiers employed by the French or by the rebels themselves it was almost impossible to tell.

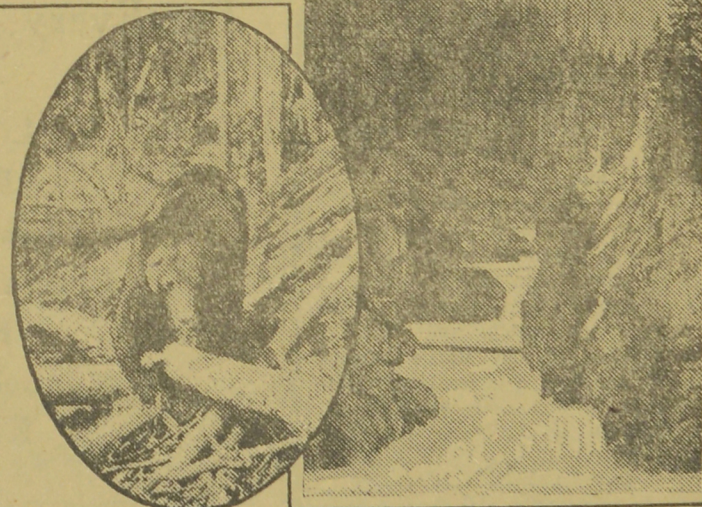

Bear Hunting In Rockies Best In Spring



In the Big Bend district of the Upper Columbia River in British Columbia lies the largest tract of grizzly bear hunting territory in the Dominion. On the two hundred mile stretch between Beavermouth and Revelstoke, both on the main line of the Canadian Pacific Railway, there are approximately thirty creeks, some large enough to be classed as rivers. Of these at least twelve are known to be the habitat of the grizzly while many of them have not heard the sound of a rifle in years.

This spring a systematic effort was made to place the hunting possibilities of this great district within the reach of prospective visitors in search of the thrill which only close quarters with Ursus Horribilis can produce. Through the co-operation of all the best known Rivermen on the Upper Columbia, trips can be made in comfort. Game and fish are plentiful and the scenery is sufficient to satisfy the desire of the most exacting mountaineer. At low water such as exists up to about the end of May it is possible to run in safety such well known waters as Surprise, Kimbasket, Gordon, Priest and Death Rapids, as well as the far-famed Canyon of the Columbia itself. This trip appeals to many as fully as the actual hunting.

As far as is known, no party of non-residents has ever made such a trip. The last pair of local hunters, who spent twenty-one days en route, brought in a bag of over fifteen bears, including several very large grizzlies and three live grizzly cubs. This happened several years ago when the present bag limit of three bears per sportsman was not in effect.

According to J. H. Munro, of Revelstoke, B.C., the bears in this district are on the move from April 20. While there are more to be had later on, the earlier the bear is killed the better condition his claws and pelt are in. Arnold Borton, one of the best known Banff guides, also advises that April and May are the best months for hunters seeking bearskins as trophies.
