Sweeping reductions have been nade in income taxation in the Fed eral Budget. Hon. J. A. Robb announc ed increase in the exemptions for sin gle persons from \$1,000 to \$1,500 a year and for married persons from \$2,000 to \$3,000. In the United States exemptions are the same as in Canada for single persons and \$3,500 for married persons, of \$500 more. The rate of income taxation in the southern republic also begins at 11/2 per cent. with a further deduction of 25 per cent. on earned incomes as compared with a rate of 2 per cent. on the first \$2,000 of taxable income and quick increases for higher incomes. 
