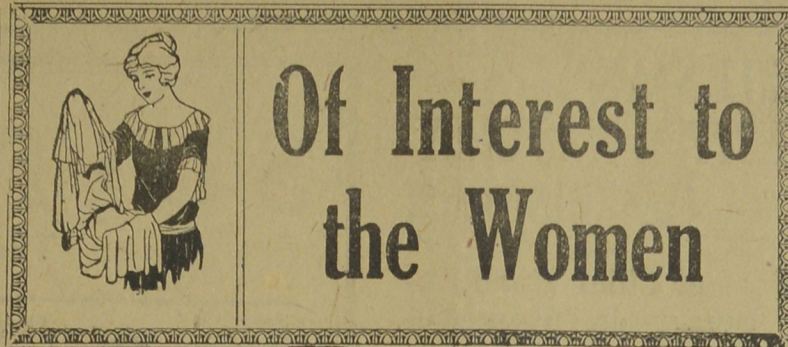

**PLEATING A-PLenty IN MODERN MODES.**

Pleating, pleating—there is much of pleating in the modern dresses. For, you see, the latest styles call for fullness with little flare, and pleats are the medium through which this effect is gained. They may be wide pleats laid in softly. They may be accordion pleats or side pleats of more or less width, as the case may be. They may be tightly stitched in box pleats or inverted ones of the same variety. They may extend in an even distribution all the way around the skirt, and they may occupy only sections of its width. But whatever the arrangement, pleats they must be so that the gown will take on the appearance of something entirely modern and up to the last word of smartness.

There is a good deal to be said in favor of the intelligent choice of stockings. They are, for obvious reasons, most important when it comes to the question of newer dresses. They must be of the right color to harmonize with the color scheme of the costume and they must be made of the right material, too, if you are bound to gain the utmost of effect. You see, silk stockings are no longer smart with sports clothes. You must wear woolen ones in this connection. And still, no matter what the thread of the stocking may be, you must have the right color always.

**ORANGE PIE.**

2 oranges.  
6 tablespoons sugar.  
Pinch salt.  
1 pint milk.  
5 tablespoons cornstarch.  
2 tablespoons butter.  
2 eggs—(white reserved for meringue).

Baked pastry shell.  
Peel, seed and cut in small pieces the oranges. Combine dry ingredients and add to oranges. Add hot milk and cook until thickened in top part of boiler. Add slightly beaten eggs and butter. Cook over hot water another 3 minutes. Let cool. Place in pastry shell. Cover with meringue made with whites and two tablespoons of sugar. Bake in oven for 10 minutes at 300 deg. F. Air vent closed in electric stove.

**MY NEIGHBOR SAYS.**

When sweeping rugs wet your broom in a basin of water to which a tablespoon of vinegar has been added.

To skin a finnan haddock, cut the fish into halves and hold it in front of a brisk fire until it begins to curl up. Then start at the tail end of the fish and pull the skin off gently, and you will find that the fish is quite clear from skin.

To keep cake from sticking to baking pans, after greasing the pans well, you should sift in some flour, shake the pans so that the flour will get all over grease, and then turn what does not stick to the pans and put in your batter.

To remove glass covers from jars place the jar top in a dipper of hot water (not boiling) and allow it to remain for five or ten minutes. Remove jar from dipper and insert a steel kitchen knife at different points under the rubber. This will let in the air. The cover can then be removed easily.

The time required to boil vegetables depends on the age of the vegetables. Asparagus (young) should be boiled 20 to 30 minutes, old 30 to 60 minutes; string beans, one to two hours; beans, shelled, one and one-half to two hours; beets, young 30 to 50 minutes, old three to five hours; cabbage, young 30 minutes, old two to two and one-half hours; cauliflower, 25 to 55 minutes.

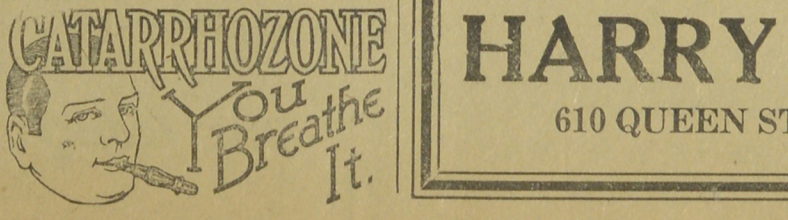

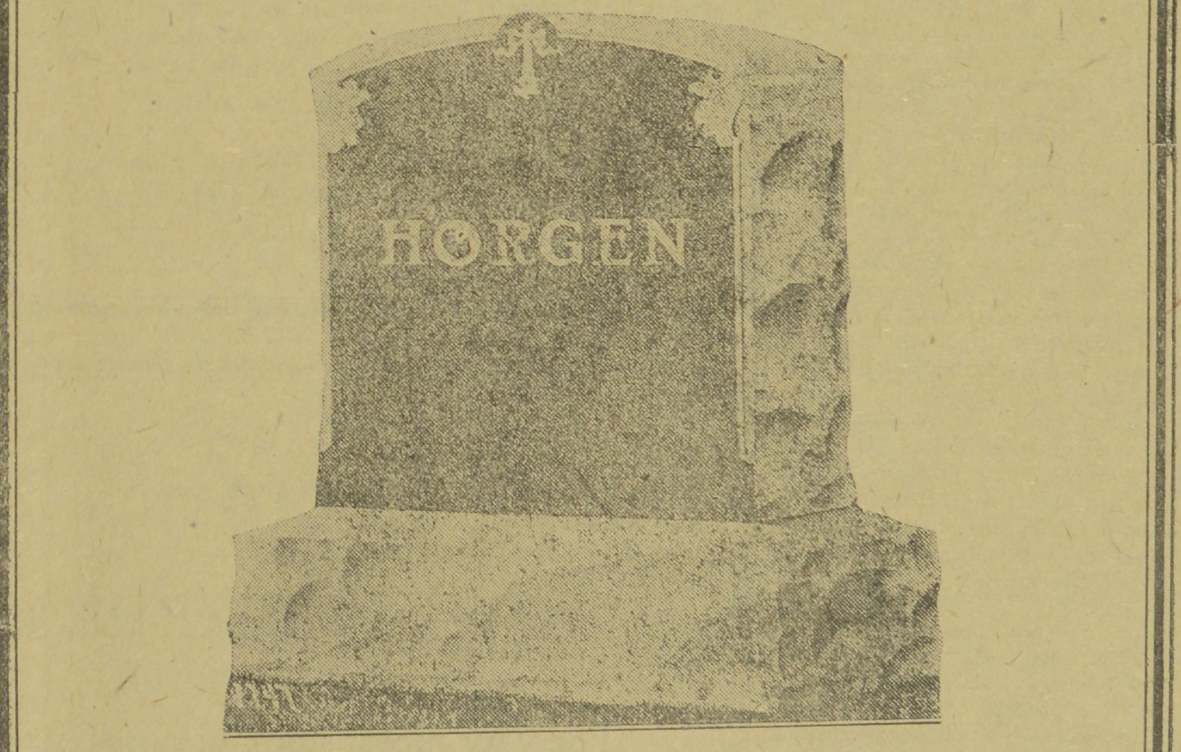
