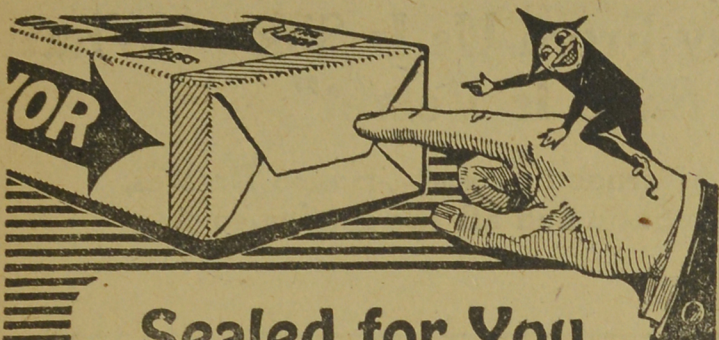

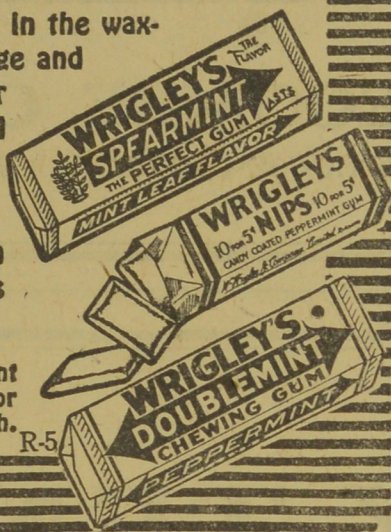

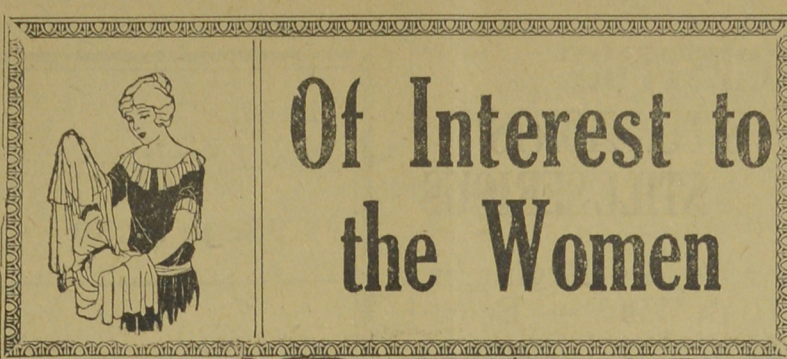

## Of Interest to the Women

### FASHIONS FADS.

### MY NEIGHBOR SAYS.

Mildew on leather can be removed by rubbing with petroleum ointment.

Wash quilts on a windy day. While they are drying they should be taken down and shaken from time to time, otherwise they will be lumpy.

The most delicate fabrics may be washed in bran water. To prepare fill a cheesecloth bag with bran, pour boiling water over it leave for 10 minutes then squeeze out the bag and remove. The water is then ready for use.

When steel becomes rusty the best way to get rid of the rust is to rub it with a piece of emery paper that has been dipped in turpentine. Polish well with a fresh piece of emery paper and you will be very pleased with the result.

To clean an incandescent gas burner without breaking the mantle take off the chimney or globe and insert an ordinary hatpin under the loop of the mantle raise it clear of the support and lower it into the globe allowing the hatpin to rest on either side of the globe. Take off the burner and clean by blowing through it. Replace and return the mantle to its position by the aid of the pin.

### Dainty Rhubarb Jelly.

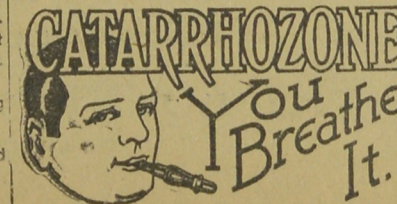
Cut one pound of red (strawberry) rhubarb into half inch pieces with out peeling put into a baking dish

in alternate layers with one cup of sugar; add the thin yellow rind of a lemon and a piece of green or dried ginger root and bake until tender but not broken. Soak one ounce (one half package) of granulated gelatine in one half cup of cold water and dissolve over hot water; then strain into the rhubarb add the juice of one lemon and pour into a mold a little at a time adding more as the mixture stiffens to prevent the pieces of rhubarb settling. Preserved Canton ginger cut in very thin slices and a little of the ginger syrup may take the place of the ginger root and is a decided improvement. This may be added after the rhubarb is cooled. Chill and serve with whipped cream.

### ORANGE JELLY.

Soak one half a package of granulated gelatine in one half cup of cold water, the time required varying somewhat with the brand; add one cup of boiling water and seven eighths cup of sugar; stir until sugar is dissolved and when cool add two cups of orange juice, including tiny particles of the pulp. If a clear jelly is desired the whole mixture may be strained through a fine sieve or double fold of cheese cloth. This mixture may be colored a deep pink with a teaspoon of cooked blueberry juice. It is then called "blood orange" jelly.

## YOUNG MAN OF 94 SETS UP IN BUSINESS

Pomona, Calif., July 7—George Thomason, 94 years old, who styles himself "a young man just starting out in business" has invested \$60,000 in a jewelry establishment here preparatory to establishing his reputation as a Pomona business man.

Mrs. Thimpon two days his junior, is closely associated with her husband's new venture. The couple have 18 children, nine sons and nine daughters, all living. All but two are twins the youngest pair being 52 and the oldest 75.

Thomason came here from Washington state where he had been in business for 57 years.

He was born at Louisville, Ky., in 1832 and was raised near Springfield, Mo. He has been married 77 years. He participated in the Civil War. He came west with his family over the Idaho trail to Spokane in a covered wagon in 1867.

## NEW GOVERNOR DRESSING UP THE CAPITAL

Warsaw, Poland, July 7—The new governor of Warsaw is continuing his strenuous efforts to improve the appearance of Poland's capital. Edicts have been issued that all publicly exhibited clocks must reveal the correct time and that spitting on the streets is subject to fine.

Another edict calls for the repairing of dilapidated house fronts. The municipality has agreed to advance credits for repairs. ## AMERICAN MOTORISTS ARE POURING INTO CANADA AT ALL THE BORDER POINTS

Sarnia, July 6—All records for recorded up to this afternoon.

entry of United States holiday tourists went by the board at this gateway to the roads of Ontario from Friday noon to Sunday noon, when upward of 6,000 United States' cars came into Ontario, bearing with them probably 25,000 people. It seemed from the scenes in Sarnia Saturday night, as if the whole of Uncle Sam's domain had taken to the road. Never in history have Sarnians seen its equal. All night Friday and all night Saturday three ferry boats piled unceasingly, but despite all efforts there was a constant waiting line on the American side of the St. Clair River. Continuous ferry service from Friday morning to Tuesday night will be served. The ferry and Customs and Immigration inspection services worked like oiled machinery. Inspecting officers worked 24 hour shifts and still the tide rolled in. There were no untoward incidents and only one accident was

The great majority of cars flying flags carried the Union Jack or Canadian flag alongside the American colors and despite unavoidable delays the tourists were all in fine humor.

### Quebec is Inundated.

Montreal, July 4—Taking advantage of the United States holiday, with its accompanying prospects of fine weather, thousands of people from the United States are pouring into Montreal and Quebec Province. All the local hotels are filled to capacity while reports from Quebec City show that the picturesque ancient Capital is also undergoing an American invasion. A polo team of United States army officers from Fort Ethan Allan are here playing a series of matches with the Montreal Polo Club.

### Congestion at Bridges.

Niagara Falls, Ont., July 4—It looks today as if all records for motor traffic will be broken by tomorrow night. Long lines of automobiles being United States license plates have been coming into Canada since Friday night and bridge officials believe that congestion beyond anything ever known will occur tomorrow night. Special arrangements are being made to move expeditiously the tremendous traffic expected. The traffic was augmented by the large numbers of racing fans coming to the Stamford track yesterday.

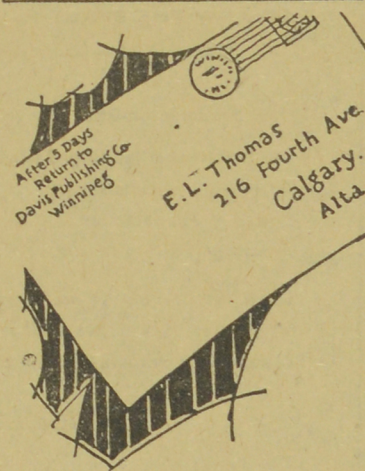
### Heavy Patrol for Traffic.

### IS NOT ENGAGED.

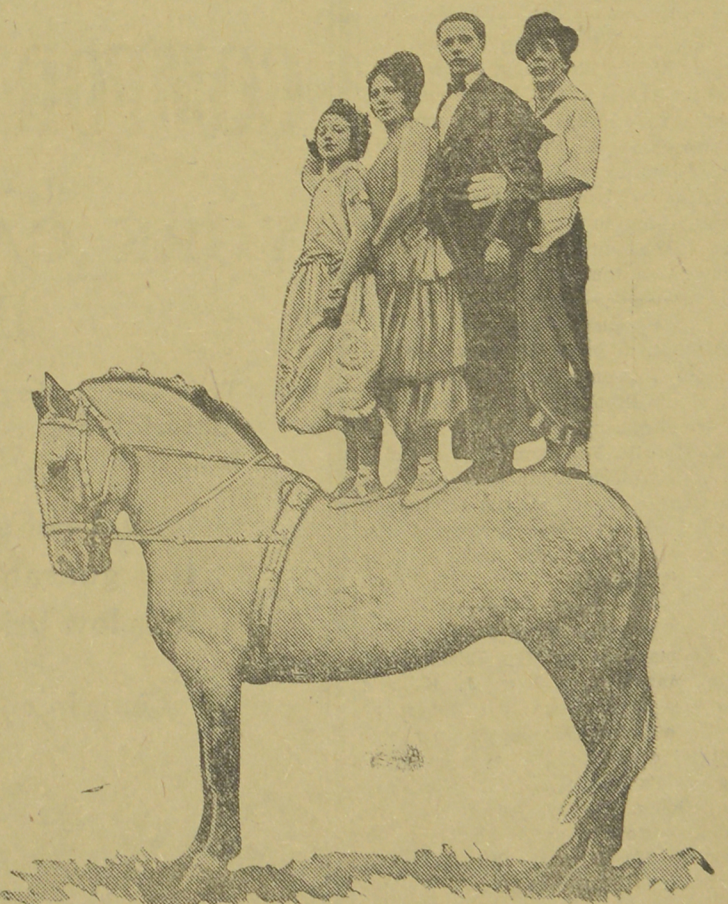
