ENGLISH MILL WORKERS OFF FOR MONEY MAKING SCENES

Manchester, Eng., Aug. 2.—Cotton mill sirens in 14 Lancashire mill towns shrieked today to indicate that the famous Lancashire "wakes"—the 10-day migratory holiday of the northern mill-hands—formally was begun.

Not a mill will start up until a week from Tuesday when their employees will have returned, having spent to the last farthing—all except 50 cents left prudently under the clock at home—every penny which they had saved for the annual "wakes."

The total sum thus saved and disbursed is enormous. Figures published early in July for 14 Lancashire towns showed that the workers in spite of the strike and of short hours in the American cotton spinning section had saved nearly \$5,000,000 for their holidays. Similar figures from mill towns in Yorkshire, Cheshire and other industrial districts bring the total up to many millions.

This money is collected by weekly subscriptions at every mill throughout the year and is a big item in Lancashire and Yorkshire

banking. It amounts to about \$15 a head or around \$50 a family. It is saved separately and has nothing to do with the family's ordinary savings account.

The banks' passbooks plainly label it "wakes money." It was drawn out yesterday on such a huge scale that the banks, as usual were forced to draw heavily on the London money market in order to finance the "wakes" with clean new bank notes, clean new bills and clean new silver.

Tomorrow every mill town will hum with the exodus. Trains will be packed to suffocation; charabancs will crowd the town squares, load up and whirl their happy occupants to Blackpool, New Brighton, Southport and other holiday places.

Yorkshire sends thousands flooding eastwards to Scarborough and Bridlington and Whitby. Other charabancs invade the South down as far as the Isle of Wight. Other parties, pooling their resources, make a bee line for the Continent.

Couples go off happily on their own, much to the interest of English playwrights who have more than once found the Lancashire "wakes" a fruitful theme for drama.

A motor-bicycle with a side car or even a "perch-perch" behind, complete with "peach" is a favorite vehicle for the grand exodus.

Authorities agree that very little money is spent for drink during the "wakes" though the crowds are rather noisy in trains and charabancs and might give the stranger a contrary impression. The money has to be spent with some care lest it give out and the holiday makers forced to return home prematurely.

The great aim of those who participate in the "wakes" is to come home on the very last day—without a penny.

WHAT SHE WEARS.

HINTS FOR HOUSEWIVES.

Soil for potted plants and flower boxes should be very rich and light. When you clean house, shift the stair carpet often enough to distribute the wear.

To put out blazing fat throw on salt, sand or ashes. Water only increases the blaze.

To remove fruit stains soak them half an hour in cold water, then pour boiling water through them and dry quickly.

Never eat a heavy meal when you are angry or unusually tired, as you are liable to pay for it with a headache or a severe attack of indigestion.

In frying it is cheaper to use a deep fat as in this way the article to be cooked takes only what it needs. Anything that soaks fat is unfit for food.

Paint stains on clothing will not remain there long if you get after them with turpentine and ammonia in equal parts. Saturate two or three times, if necessary and wash out in white soap suds.

CANNED PEAS.

(Cold Pack Method)

Be careful when shelling the peas not to make yourself double work. Do not put the shelled peas back into the bowl with the unshelled ones; have a bowl or pan for the peas, one for the pods and a quart measure for the peas. When you put the shelled peas in with the peas, the blossoms and leaves must be picked out. Then, too, I have seen housewives put the peas in pan of cold water and pour off whatever floats on top. They forget that the very young and tender pea floats on top and so they are wasted or it takes a long time to pick out the leaves and blossoms from the peas.

Therefore put the peas in one vessel, the shells in another; then shelled peas are put in quart measure, then you save measuring the amount when needed for each jar.

Put the shelled peas into wire basket or fine strainer, plunge into boiling water. Pack in well sterilized jar, fill jar with boiling water to cover flowing and one level teaspoon of salt to each quart of water; adjust rubber that has been dipped into boiling water, put on top but do not fasten set in boiler on rack fill boiler and boil one and one half hours; then fasten tops lay on side and boil ten minutes. Remove from boiler, wipe and be sure tops are tight. When cold, set away in cool dark place.

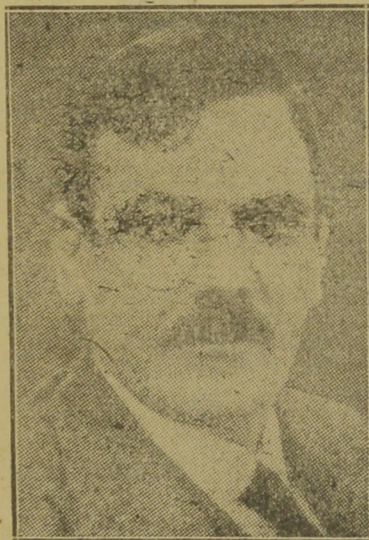

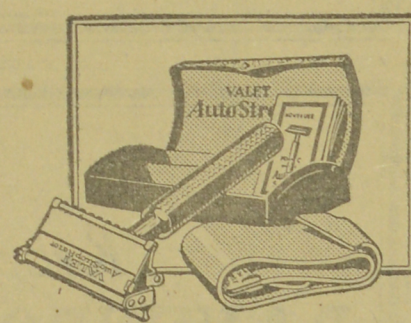
