

## TANGLED SITUATION ABOUT HOUSE

### R. P. Gorham Has No Official Permit to Build But is Told to Go Ahead.

The City Council last night discussed the pros and cons of R. P. Gorham's applications for a building permit and for water. The final result was that he was told he would be given a temporary supply of water and permanent connection later if possible, also to go ahead with his building operation and if possible a permit would be issued.

"Unofficially I have a building permit. Officially I have not", was Mr. Gorham's summing up of the situation. Mr. Gorham who is in the Entomological Service appeared in person.

#### Reserved Street Not a Street.

Mr. Gorham's lot is situated on a reserved street fifty feet wide running from University Avenue on the southerly side of the C. P. R. track. The street has no name and does not meet the requirement in the city laws of a width of sixty-six feet at least. For these reasons the City Clerk could not issue Mr. Gorham a building permit, the city could take over the street and the Water Department could not lay a main in it. Originally the property belonged to the New Brunswick & British Colonization Co. As that company is defunct the reserved street has no owner. Mr. Gorham bought the property from Ald. Moses Mitchell. The latter informed the council that others who had purchased lots adjoining also intended to build.

#### To Get Full Width.

An attempt will be made to have owners of the land deed sixteen feet off their fronts to give a full width street. That would solve the problem.

#### CITY AFFAIRS

##### Grant For Caretaker.

Maurice Allen, caretaker of the Motor Tourist Camping Ground, was appointed a special constable by the City Council Monday night. He also was voted twenty-five dollars for his services as caretaker.

##### Protest Against Over-Assessment.

The G. N. Babbitt Estate through C. R. Barry has protested against over-assessment since 1907. The allegation is that the estate has been assessed for lots in University Avenue which are not owned by it. Adjustment was made for 1925 only. The Finance Committee will consider the matter.

##### Contract For Dwelling.

The contract of Winslow Clark of this city for building a dwelling house of wood for E. G. Merritt at Barker's Point has been accepted. The work to be started at once. The building is to be one and one-half stories on the site of the one recently burned. The price is in the vicinity of \$3,000.

##### On Motor Tour.

F. G. Spencer of Saint John and his family were in Fredericton today on a motor tour which will include New Brunswick places and others. Mr. Spencer who is president of the amusement firm F. G. Spencer Limited, is recovering from his serious illness.

##### To Meet at Saint John.

The city has been informed that the New Brunswick Power Commission will be in session in Saint John tomorrow August 4th. The Commission had been asked to meet in Fredericton so that there could be some discussion on the distribution of Grand Falls power in its relation to Fredericton.

##### Objects to Assessment.

Charles E. Boone of this city, road-master for the C. N. R., has made a protest against assessment in Fredericton on income on the ground that his work is performed not in this city but in the counties of Carleton, York, Sunbury and Queen's. The matter has been referred to the Assessment Appeals Committee of the City Council for action.

##### Returned From Motor Trip.

## JAMES DALY LET GO ON OWN RECOGNIZANCE

### Alleged Bigamist Looks For Job at Fredericton Junction — His Bond Set at \$1,200.

James Daly of Worcester, Mass., after spending more than a month in gaol on a charge of bigamy and being remanded five different times, some times at the request of his own counsel and some times at the request of the counsel for the prosecution, was let go this morning on his own recognizance in \$1,200 to reappear if wanted. As Daly for some time has been in the condition known as "broke", the recognizance is not very weighty.

Sitting Magistrate E. Allison McKay presided in the police court this morning when the case came up. J. B. Dickson appeared for the defence and P. J. Hughes, K. C., for the prosecution. The court announced that the accused would be allowed to go as the prosecution was not prepared to go on with the case. It has been extremely difficult to get information from Worcester relative to Daly's first marriage and the divorce which he claims he got.

#### Looking For a Job.

Daly being told that there was a chance to get a job in a sawmill at Fredericton Junction, started out for that place. The car which he had when arrested was in the charge of his counsel for a time and afterward was seized by the customs the time limit having been over-stayed.

#### Invitation For the Mayor.

His Worship Mayor Clark has received an invitation to attend the official opening of the Grand Falls development on August 10th. Many other invitations have been received by residents of Fredericton and vicinity. A special train running from Saint John to Grand Falls over the C. N. R. is to pick up the invited guests and bring them back.

## COUNTY WANTS SHARE OF POLICE COURT FINES

### City Wants One-third of Jury Fees and of Surplus Record Office Fees.

The City Council in committee Monday night discussed the claim of the city against the county and the counter claim against the city. Ald. Goodspeed reported informally to the council stating that an offer of about fifty percent of the city's claim had been made by the county for settlement. His own opinion was that the city should press for payment of one-third of the jury fees paid by the Province to the county, also one third of the surplus record office fees.

#### County Claims Police Court Fines.

Ald. Goodspeed also stated that the county had entered a counter claim against the city for some of the police court fines. The only thing to do in that connection would be to await the return of Police Magistrate Limerick from Europe and get from him a statement of the collections in fines and thus find out what the county claimed.
