**Provincial Grand Preceptory Opened This Afternoon—W. J. Matthews of Moncton is Grand Master.**

The Provincial Grand Black Preceptory, Royal Black Knights of Ireland opened its annual meeting here this afternoon at 2.30. Delegates numbered between seventy-five and one hundred.

The presiding officer is Grand Master W. J. Matthews of Moncton. He presented a report as also did Grand Treasurer Arthurs of Saint John and Grand Secretary L. A. Palmer of Bathurst.

### Attended Legislature.

The Preceptory adjourned at 3.30 to permit delegates to attend the session of the Legislature and many took seats in the galleries.

The Preceptory will meet tonight and possibly Wednesday morning.

Delegates to the various organizations began to arrive this morning and more will arrive tonight and tomorrow. Upwards of two hundred delegates in all will be in attendance at the meetings which will occupy Wednesday and Thursday.

### Fire at Dumfries.

On Sunday, April 18th, the home of Bedford Kelley of Dumfries was completely destroyed by fire. With the kind help of the neighbors the barns were saved and nearly all the furniture carried out of the burning dwelling. Being late in the afternoon the family was moved to neighbors homes and cared for. The property was a rented one being owned by the Fraser Companies Limited.

### Death at Bear Island.

Mr. Emery Parent, a well known resident of Bear Island, died last week after a lingering illness aged sixty-eight years. Besides a sorrowing wife he is survived by two daughters Mrs. J. McCatten of Rosedale, Carleton County, and Mrs. Bert Harris of McAdam, and one sister Miss Amanda Parent of Woodstock. The deceased was a staunch Conservative in politics. He was well known along the river and was an expert pilot. Interment was made on Sunday at the Union Cemetery, Bear Island, with services by Rev. Mr. Strofford.

### Died at Malden, Mass.

The death of John White, occurred at Malden, Mass., Monday in his 85th year. The deceased had been a guest of his sister Mrs. Christina McFarlane of Nashwaakasis until about five weeks ago when he returned to Malden. Relatives survive in Fredericton, Saint John and the United States. The body will be brought here for interment at Douglas, Wednesday. The service will be by Rev. Dr. Sutherland at three o'clock. Interment will be in the Pickard cemetery.

### A Good Entertainment.

A large audience enjoyed the Variety Entertainment at the Parish Hall last evening. The first number, Dickens' "Bardell vs Pickwick" was a pleasing novelty. The Schoolroom Scene, the second number on the programme, under the direction of Mrs. C. W. Wade and Miss Ethel M. ## SYNOD OPENS WITH A LARGE ATTENDANCE

The Diocesan Synod opened its annual sessions here this morning with a very large attendance of the clergy and also of lay delegates. The morning session took place in Christchurch Cathedral where Holy Communion was administered at service at ten o'clock the delivery of the charge of His Lordship the Bishop following.

The charge of His Lordship which was long and contained much of importance to both the Diocese and to the general public, was completed at about noon when the Synod rose to reassemble at 2.30 in the Memorial Hall for the first business session.

Tonight the Synod service is to be held at the Cathedral. The preacher is Rev. A. L. Fleming, the rector of St. John's (Stone) Church St. John.
