### FIFTY-TWO FLAGG DEAD

New York, Sept. 8-Jared Flagg, once known as "52 per cent" Flagg whose financial schemes and under world connections brought him frequently to the attention of the police has made his last explanation to authorities.

While being questioned in the office of the state bureau for the prevention of frauds Thursday, Flagg suddenly crumpled in his chair and slipped to the floor, dying from heart disease. He was 72.

Flagg son of an Episcopal clergyman first gained notoriety when he was tried and sentenced to 30 days in the tohmbs for the rental or "Flagg's Flatts" to members of the underworld.

In 1907 he opened a broker's office with a "sure way of beating Wall street," guaranteeing one per cent a week profit, "no matter which way the market goes" to those who invested with him. His 18 months sentence to Atlanta was finally set
