


(Mr. and Mrs. Maltby and children expect to leave Dawson early in July (Mr. Maltby is a nephew of Miss Dora Hanson of this city.)

EXPORTS OF PULPWOOD

Ottawa, May 24-Canada exported with 1219 eggs and 1174.8 points. 71,256 cords of pulpwood, valued at \$163.045 to the United States last month. There were no exports of this commodity to other countries in April. During the previous month the total amount exported was 146,091 ords, worth \$1,334,600.

Approximately 99,071,600 pounds of woodpulp worth \$2,776,307 were exported to the United States. This total shipment of 111,958,900 pounds according to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics shows a decline as compared with the previous month. In March 186,244,400 pounds of woodpulp, worth \$5,131,699 were exported to the United States and other countries.

Washington, May 25-Civilization is making life miserable for the honey bee. Sprays used in orchards about blossom time to kill harmful insects, Government experts have found, are fatal to many of the busy bees because of the injection of arsenic in their nectar.

The Agriculture Department recommends spraying after most of the blossoms have fallen. Such a course is just as effective against the harm-
