# CENTENARY OF TOM SAYERS CHAMPION

Born at Brighton in 1826 - Lost But One Bout in Eleven Years, London Rules.

One hundred years ago Tuesday Tom Sayers famous Englishman, who was a fighter in the days when boxing was fighting and not the clever scientific sport it now is, was born in Brighton. Most, if not all of his "fights" were under London Prize Ring rules. At the age of 23 years he quit his trade as a bricklayer and engaged in "prize fights" another term now obsolete. The boxers of today are hired for guaranteed sums to display their prowess in quite the same way as in hockey, baseball or other professional sports. Sayers was beaten only once in eleven years, meeting defeat in a battle with Nat Langham in 1853. He was a compact and powerful man of 5 feet 8 inches in height and yet.
