lay professional baseball is unlawful in Pennsylvania under a decision of the Dauphin County Court which defined it as "a worldly employment," in violation of the old Pennsylvania Blue 3 0 4 laws of 1794.

The court denied the Philadelphia American League Baseball Club the "right, privilege or authority to main tain or conduct any games of base ball in the city of Philadelphia on

The club's counsel indicated it would take an appeal to the State Supreme Court.

The decision held that the act of 1794 includes baseball within its erms, although such a game was unknown at the time of its passage. The case reached the court through proceeding by Atty Gen. Woodruff Called at Saint John against the club as the result of a game played between the Athletics and the Chicago White Sox, Aug. 22.
