## ORANGE PUFFS.

1-3 cup shortening  
1 cup sugar  
2 eggs  
1-2 cup orange juice  
Grated rind of orange  
1 3-4 cups gold medal flour  
3 teaspoons baking powder  
Cream sugar and shortening together. Add the well beaten eggs. Sift the flour and baking powder together. Add to the first mixture alternately with the orange juice. Add the grated orange rind and mix well. Put in greased individual cups or muffin tins and bake 15 minutes in moderate oven (375 deg. F.) Serve with orange sauce.

## ORANGE JELLY.

2 tablespoons granulated gelatine  
1-2 cupful cold water  
1 1-2 cupfuls orange juice  
1 1-2 cupfuls boiling water  
1 cup granulated sugar  
3 tablespoons lemon juice  
Soak the gelatine five minutes in cold water. Dissolve in the boiling water and add to the sugar cold, and add the fruit juices. Pour into mold and let chill.

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
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
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
