FAITH HEALING EVANGELIST LOST HIS TEMPER AND CURSED

Kansas City, Mo., Nov. 23—Mrs. Jessie B. Walker, 30 years old, has been granted a default divorce decree from the Rev. Carl C. Walker, evangelist and faith healer, who conducted meetings some time ago in a tabernacle at 31st street and Indiana avenue.

Mrs. Walker filed her suit Oct. 4, stating they were married April 27, 1912, at Riverside, Calif., and lived together until Aug. 30. According to the petition, Walker had an "ungovernable temper," and on numerous occasions "became violently angry and cursed." The wife alleged Walker possessed property valued at \$50,000 and that he was capable of earning \$12,000 a year from his faith-healing evangelism.

Blonde and blue-eyed, Mrs. Walker told of her married life before she took the stand in Judge Fred W. Coon's division of the circuit court.

"There is no doubt he had some wonderful cures when he was with God, and God left him when he had no faith," Mrs. Walker said. "I did not tell all my story in the petition. My friends wondered why I stood it all so long. I loved him and sought to help him."

She indicated there were other grievances besides the ungovernable temper and the cursing that made her married life unhappy.

They had met in Oregon, where they studied Christian evangelistic work.

"He Was Punished."

Mrs. Walker declared her husband felt the punishment of the lord since he became a transgressor. She cited that a tent in which he was preaching in Iowa recently was blown down.

Mrs. Walker said she had done everything in her power to restore her husband's love for her after he had told her in the presence of others that he no longer loved her. She had continued to work with him in his faith healing.

Mrs. Walker said her husband had made a property settlement with her, including a home in Joplin. Mrs. Walker told Judge Coon she was living at the home of Mrs. J. P. Marbut, 3708 Bellefontaine avenue. The Walkers have no children.

A feature of Walker's services was the casting aside of crutches and walking sticks by the lame whom he professed to heal. A stack of crutches was in the tabernacle here, no longer needed by the lame who had been healed by the evangelist. Walker was a member of the Ku Klux Klan, according to Mrs. Walker, and was a leader in Klan activities here. A damage suit was filed against Walker by a musical director at the Walker tabernacle. Walker, it was alleged, had made insulting accusations against the director before the congregation.

Mrs. Walker said her husband "better not contest the divorce" or she would tell "everything she knew about him." She said she had been educated in music. Her work with Walker had been the editing of a magazine which she said he declared publicly was edited by himself.




WHY IS THIS WRONG?

Of Interest to the Women

POINTS SHOPPER MUST REMEMBER WHEN BUYING FURS.

Furs every woman should choose from the following viewpoints are:

"For hard, long wear—choose mink, beaver, Alaska seal, mink, skunk, fisher, raccoon, dyed muskrat (Hudson seal), Russian sable, olinsky.

"For light or dress wear—choose marten, fox, natural quail, silver muskrat, American roadtail, caracul.

"For grace and beauty solely—choose broadtail, chinchilla and mole.

"Where price is the chief element—choose marmot or seal-dyed cony sealion or near seal).

"For sports wear—choose raccoon, natural muskrat, leopard, ocelot, civet cat, sheared leopard cat, opossum, pony, kidskin.

"For tall slender figure—choose long haired furs, skunk, raccoon, fitch, marten, badger, wolf, fox.

"For short stout figures—choose the short haired furs, mink, natural muskrat, dyed muskrat, kolinsky squirrel, flat caracul, mole."

MY NEIGHBOR SAYS.

Before baking an apple, to prevent it from bursting, run your knife around the rim about an inch from the top.

When hot flannels are wanted in illness try heating them in a steamer and you will then avoid the trouble of wringing.

To clean painted kitchen walls, dip a damp cloth in dry baking soda wipe the walls then go over again with another damp cloth.

Do not throw your coffee grounds into the garbage can. They should be emptied into the sink as they will help materially in keeping the drain pipe clean.

To fasten off an eyelet so that it will not unravel work the last three stitches slightly loose, then run the needle back through them. With the point of the needle draw them up firmly and then fasten the thread first. Cut off the end closely.


LITTLE SPONGE CAKES.

One half cup sugar, 1/2 cup flour, 3 eggs, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1/4 teaspoon salt, flavor with lemon or vanilla, 2 teaspoons lemon juice. Beat egg yolks with the lemon juice until very light. Whip the whites stiff and whip the sugar into them. Add the yolks; then the flour sifted with the salt and baking powder. Flavor and bake in patty pans in a slow oven.

MARMALADE DROPS.

One cup sugar, 1/2 cup butter or other shortening, 2 eggs, 3 cups flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon soda, 3/4 cup orange marmalade. Mix in the order given. Drop by teaspoon onto greased tins, about two inches apart and bake until brown. Remove from the pans as soon as taken from the oven.


