**WALKING STICKS AND OTHER DETAILS.**

Acquiring the jaunty habit of carrying a cane is one of the things expected of the woman who goes in for sports clothes just now. Even at Biarritz and San Sebastian, where there is no necessity of carrying a staff for mountain climbing or anything of the like, the woman without a stick is rare. When starting out for a brisk promenade, wielding one's stick, it seems customary to omit a handbag, a small purse holding in one's pocket whatever cash one may require. At other times, however, the handbag is a most important part of one's costume, proclaiming one either in the vanguard or not.

Styles in handbags have a fascination for most of us, because they are so varied and so costly that one is forever fearful that, having purchased one of these lovely things, there will be nothing left to put in it, nothing that is, excepting the lipsticks and compacts, samples and whatnots that a woman invariably collects. Or course a pocket comb is one of the necessities and there are folding ones which when opened, are sizable but which being folded three times, fit into a brocade or leather case.

Handkerchiefs continue to be colored, the greatest change being the scallops and other irregularities of the edges. They are frequently in flower shapes, or only so at the corners but the edges are sure to be colored if the centres are white. One occasionally sees the colored centre with white border. Many women effect plain squares of crepe with whipped edge in black that is if the crepe is sufficiently bright which it usually is. White handkerchiefs are always effective, and highly colored they are less in evidence than in the old days when they were tied about the wrist, or obviously pocketed for decorative effect. Perhaps one of the nicest things about the present-day fashions is that there appears to be a reason for everything, and therefore one is less conscious of details than when they are added merely for effect.

**CHEESE MUFFINS.**

3 tablespoons shortening  
1-2 teaspoon salt  
1 egg  
1 cup milk  
2 cups flour  
5 teaspoons baking powder  
6 tablespoons grated cheese

Cream the shortening; add egg well beaten; sift baking powder with flour, add cheese and add to the first mixture, alternating with milk. Bake in oiled tin gem pans at 375 deg. F.

**CHICKEN ROLLS.**

From raised dough save tiny biscuits and bake. Mince enough cold boiled chicken to fill a cup. Season the chicken with pepper, salt and a tablespoon each of whipped cream and well seasoned mayonnaise, a tablespoon of very finely minced celery and a teaspoon of chopped capers. Open each hot biscuit and fill with a teaspoon of the mixture. Serve hot, with 2 or 3 sprays of fresh cress and a red radish.

**SANDWICH FILLING.**

1 lb. raisins  
1-2 lb figs  
1 1-2 cups sugar  
1 tablespoon flour  
1-4 cup cold water  
1-2 cup orange juice  
2 lemons (juice and grated rind)

Chop the raisins and figs and combine with the flour and sugar. Add orange juice, lemon juice and water and cook in a double boiler or steamer until thick.

This amount will make 3 3-4 cups of filling and will fill 50 medium-sized sandwiches. Here's another filling:

4 lbs cottage or cream cheese  
2 cups chopped green peppers  
2 cups chopped nuts  
1 pt mayonnaise


