## Not Satisfied With Inspectors and Vendors

### N.B. Alliance Executive Report Covers Activities of Year—Presented to Alliance in Annual Session Today—What Alliance Wants in the Way of Prohibition Enforcement.

The annual report of the Executive of the New Brunswick Temperance Alliance was adopted by the executive Monday night at a meeting held in the alliance office, Royal Bank Building, Donald Fraser of Plaster Rock was in the chair and all the members were present.

The report was presented to the Alliance today at the annual meeting in the Brunswick Street Baptist Church.

#### The Report

The report is as follows: Your Executive desires to place before the Convention a record of some of the work done during the past Convention year.

In many ways the year has been a very eventful one, and one in which much work has been done, and in which much progress has been made. During the year 26 meetings of the Executive Committee and Sub Committee have been held, and careful consideration has been given to the many and varied questions brought before the Committee. Your Executive has sought, to the best of its judgment and ability, to care for the work of the Alliance.

The semi-annual meeting of the Alliance was held in Moncton on July 7th, 1925. The Executive Committee met in the morning, the convention in the afternoon, and a public meeting was held in the City Hall in the evening.

On August 1st, 1925, the Rev. T. D. Bell retired from the office of Field Secretary, and since that time the position has been vacant.

#### Branch Organization

We have sought to continue our Branch organizations throughout the Province, and to keep in touch with them as far as possible, and your Officers since the semi annual meeting at Moncton have visited Woodstock, Plaster Rock, Marysville, Campbellton, Newcastle, Chatham, Sackville, Moncton, Sussex, Saint John, Minto, Fredericton Jct., Tracey, McAdam, and other places. Church conferences and conventions, Sons of Temperance Divisions, Social Service Councils, Young Peoples Societies, and other gatherings have been attended by your Officers, and addresses given on different phases of our work.

#### Temperance Bulletin

The Temperance Bulletin has been issued each month during the year, and we have sought to make it an effective agent in promoting our cause. We have sent out on an average for each of the 12 months 5,500 copies. We have received very many favourable, and complimentary references during the year to the Bulletin, and the work done by it. Those most familiar with the work of the Alliance are certain that the Bulletin played a very important part in bringing about the favourable position now occupied by the Temperance forces in this Province.

#### Provincial Election

Some time before the Provincial Election on August 10, 1925, your Executive sent out to all the Candidates the following letter:

"We are intending to publish in The Bulletin a statement of the attitude towards the Prohibitory Law and its enforcement of the several candidates in the coming election.

"We are desirous that the statement shall be fair and accurate as representing the candidates' own views, and as your name is given as one of the Candidates seeking election, we are writing you asking that you will kindly give us your own statement as to your attitude to the Prohibitory Law and its Enforcement.

"Trusting to receive an early answer, I am on behalf of the Temperance Alliance."

Satisfactory replies were received from most of the Candidates. The members elected who were pledged to the enforcement of the prohibitory law numbered 37, those who failed to give any satisfactory assurance, 11. Total 48. Some of the men elected who did not give satisfactory replies professed to be good Temperance men, and to be anxious to promote Temperance.

The result of the election in returning so many members pledged to enforce the Prohibitory Law was very gratifying and encouraging to Temperance people, and should be a very suggestive lesson. It has given to an-

other Government the opportunity to accomplish what its predecessor failed to do. Prior to the election we had the assurance of the present Premier and that of the party convention, that if his party should be returned to office he would see that the prohibitory law was properly enforced, and that sufficient time should be given to an honest enforcement of the law, so as fairly to test its efficiency before any change should be made in the principle and spirit of the law, and then not until the people themselves expressed a desire for such a change. The Governor in his speech at the opening of the Legislature says:

"It is the intention of my Government efficiently to enforce the laws of this Province including the law relating to the sale of intoxicants. A new Chief Inspector has been appointed who has just completed the districting of the Province and the appointment of his staff. His work will demonstrate to what extent it is possible to overcome the indifference with relation to this law which has become widespread among the people and to combat the efforts of those who, for personal gain have persistently set the law at defiance."

We are pleased to note that some of the pledges of better enforcement are being carried out, and as the Officers become more familiar with their work, and better understand the situation, we are expecting a steady improvement throughout the Province and the fulfillment of all the Government's pledges made to us.

#### Inspectors and Vendors

Your committee made to the Government a nomination for the office of Chief Inspector, but for political reasons our nominee was not appointed. Your committee have however sought loyally to support the appointee of the Government. We have offered to the Chief Inspector the use of all the information at our disposal; and any help that we may be able to give him in his work, and have aided him in every way open to us.

We regret the delay in the appointment of a new Chief Inspector after the Governments assuming office, and the many unsatisfactory appointments made as vendors and inspectors, especially, during that delay. We are trusting that as speedily as possible these undesirable appointments, that ought never to have been made, may be cancelled.

#### What is Wanted

If success is to be assured, instead of appointing men for political purposes, irrespective of fitness or unfitness for their work, men must be appointed whose desire it is to enforce the law, and not merely to draw a salary, and nominally fill an office. Vendors must be appointed simply to provide for the need under the law, and must be law keepers, and not notorious law breakers, such as in a number of cases have been appointed. Violators of the law must have their licenses taken away, and that without any unnecessary delay. The brewers must be made to comply with the law and their output constantly inspected. If inspectors allow continued violations of the law in their districts, it should be held as prima facie evidence that they are not doing their duty; as violators cannot in ordinary cases continue long without getting caught if inspectors do their duty. When these conditions are fulfilled we may be sure of a reasonably satisfactory enforcement of the law.

#### Dominion Election

An election for the Dominion Parliament was held during the year, and though some of the politicians said prohibition was not an issue in that election, and sought to evade the question of prohibitory enforcement, we went on quietly with our work and sent to each of the candidates the following letter:

"The Temperance Alliance is very much interested in the present Dominion Election, as on the men elected will depend the assistance we gain from the Dominion Parliament in the work of Prohibition.

"We shall be glad to know if you should be elected, whether we can depend upon your support in co-operating with the United States in preventing the smuggling of liquors out of and into Canada, and the refusing of brewers' and distillers' licenses in Provinces under Prohibition, and the pro-

motion generally of prohibition throughout the Dominion.

"We shall be pleased to receive a reply at your earliest convenience, addressed to The Temperance Alliance, Royal Bank Building, Fredericton, N. B."

With only two exceptions all the candidates replied to our questions, eight out of the eleven elected sent satisfactory replies.

#### Work to be Done

It will be necessary to make arrangements for the appointment of a Field Secretary to look after the work throughout the Province, if our work is to be effectively carried on; and our financial arrangements need to be placed upon a permanent basis. Providing a more generous provision can be made for financing our work, the work could be greatly extended and made more effective.

At this Convention it should be our aim to so plan our work as to make it more efficient than it has ever been. We have every reason for encouragement in our work and our past success is an indication of greater successes still to come.

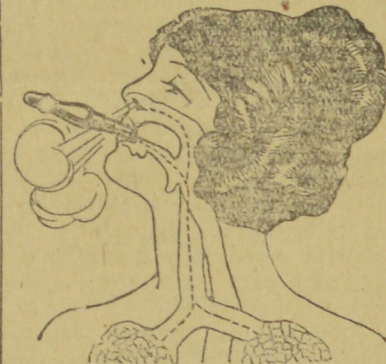
#### WHEAT FROM BUFFALO SENT VIA SAINT JOHN

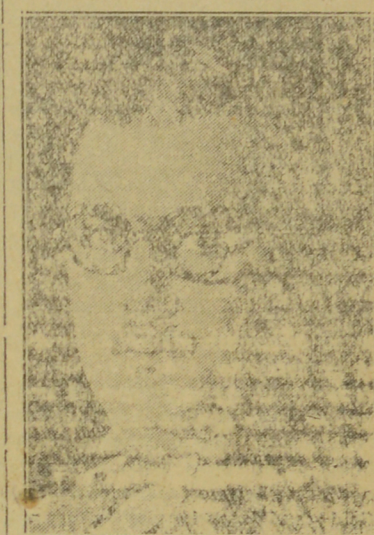

### EXPECTATION OF LIFE INCREASING YEAR BY YEAR

Interesting Facts Revealed by  
Metropolitan Life Insurance  
Company

One of the most interesting facts that has come to light recently is the news that over five years has been added to the expectation of life of the average citizen. That is to say, increased knowledge of how to prevent and fight disease has given to mankind five years more in which to live. similar ailments are gradually being eliminated by the progress of science. Over \$4,000,000 was spent by Metropolitan Life in 1925 through various offices in this continent in health and welfare work among policyholders. In Canada no less than 200,000 visits were paid by Metropolitan nurses to 45,574 patients among over industrial and group policyholders. Over two and three quarter million pamphlets were distributed in Canada, some two hundred and forty thousand being used by health, nursing, social, medical, doctors and teachers, who were very appreciative of them.

In addition to its direct work the Company has co-operated effectively with others similarly engaged. Substantial financial aid has been given to the Canadian Social Hygiene Council, the Canadian National Committee for Mental Hygiene, the Province of Quebec Safety League and to local Anti-Tuberculosis Leagues. Metropolitan representatives aided in the control of twenty-five epidemics throughout the country, participated in forty-five health campaigns, arranged thirteen clean-up campaigns and seventeen health exhibits. A notable activity in Montreal was their action in supplying the children of some three hundred families with free immunization against diphtheria, with the object of giving the city health authorities a practical demonstration of the value of such prevention work. The direct result was that the City Council voted money to supply the poor with sera and vaccines free of cost.

The total insurance in force amounts to \$12,097,246,792, on 35,222,356 policies, representing a gain in 1925 of \$1,574,762,023.
