## HON. DR. MANION EXPOUNDS THE CONSERVATIVE POLICY IN SPEECH AT CAMPBELLTON

Campbellton, Aug. 15—In an address of nearly an hour in length, Hon. R. J. Manion, Postmaster-General of Canada, gave a clear exposition of the policies of the Conservative party before a record audience in the Opera House here last night. Mr. Manion dealt at some length with the outstanding issues of the present election campaign and used caustic words on criticizing the administration of the King government.

"The insane policies of Mr. King," declared the speaker during his discourse, "were shutting down our factories, sapping out country of its youth and driving us into the arms of the United States." Later Mr. Manion declared, "I am not sure that Mr. King was not doing this on purpose. It has been hinted in some parts that MacKenzie King is pro-American and I am not sure that he isn't."

### Meighen's Policy.

In dealing with Premier Meighen's Maritime policy the speaker quoted from Hansard a portion of a resolution brought before the House by Mr. Meighen which contained the Conservative platform as for as the Maritimes are concerned. This provided for a tariff to protect the farmers and manufacturers of the east, called for the use of Maritime ports and provided for an effective and satisfactory revision of freight rates. The adjustment of the freight rates problem, Mr. Manion declared, would be one of the first tasks Mr. Meighen would tackle if placed at the head of Canada's affairs. As a first step toward the achievement of something worth while in this connection the Premier had selected a Maritime man as minister of railways.

### Upholds Byng.

Mr. Manion categorically defended the attitude of the Governor-General in the matter of dissolution of Parliament. The only constitutional issue in this campaign is whether we are Canadians are going to keep our youth at

home, develop our industries and our resources and build up a strong Canadian constitution, or whether under such policies as those of Mr. King we are going to build up the American constitutions. That is the constitutional issue and the only one before the people of Canada today, he said.

### Attacks Robb Budget.

During his address, Mr. Manion criticized the Robb budget and computing its benefit, declared that the saving of two or three cents per month by the average person through the belated reduction of postage was about the extent of the benefit to be derived from Mr. Robb's budget.

### Customs Scandal.

The speaker dealt at some length with the customs scandal, alleging that between \$30,000,000 and \$40,000,000 of the people's money had been lost through the degeneracy of this vital department. He stated that those who had first made alarming discoveries had begged Mr. King in vain for action and declared that the only punishment the ex-Premier had visited upon Mr. Bureau, who had debauched the department, was to appoint him to the senate.

### Tariff Matters.

Mr. Manion outlined the Conservative tariff policy which would protect Canadian industries and Canadian farmers. Mr. Meighen was not advocating a high tariff but a stable one. We want to give the people some assurance that they are not going to have their heads taken off next year and handed to Mr. Forke on a platter to keep Mr. King in office, he said.

In closing, Mr. Manion made a plea for support of the Conservative party on a return to stable and honest government. He also spoke highly of Mr. Culligan, the Conservative candidate for Restigouche-Madawaska.

Hon. George B. Jones, Minister of Labor, also briefly addressed the meeting, dealing with many important issues of the campaign.

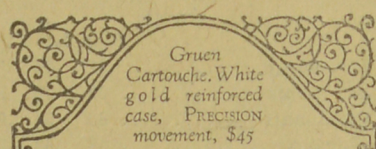
