Divorce Refused.

Upwards of a year ago Claybourne's wife brought action against him for divorce. The suit came to trial before Hon. O. S. Crockett who refused to grant a decree not being satisfied with the evidence and also intimating that some of the evidence appeared to indicate collusion particularly incidents of the wife discovering the husband in compromising situations.

ADELE FOWLIE IS CHARGED WITH BOSTON LARCENY

Former Resident of This City and Saint John— Alleged She and Man Passed a Bogus Cheque.

The startling intelligence that Miss Adele Fowlie has been arrested in Boston on a charge of larceny has been received here. The young woman is a former resident of Fredericton and has relatives living here now. Earl F. Newberry of Detroit, Mich., is reported to have been arrested with Miss Fowlie on the same charge, the arrest being made at the Boylston street subway station by Inspectors Loughlin and Connolly.

Passed Bogus Cheque for \$2,000.

Details of the alleged offence are that Newberry and Miss Fowlie appeared at the office of the American Fireworks Company, Summer street Boston, a few days ago and represented themselves as promoters. They proceeded with the purchase of fireworks to the value of \$2,000 for which they gave a worthless cheque. The transaction was followed by the swearing out of a warrant for the two in the Municipal Court the girl's name being given as V. G. Adele Fowlie. Her age was given as 25 and Newberry's as 32.

Formerly Stenographer Here.

Miss Fowlie when located in Fredericton was employed as a stenographer with the Provincial Department of Public Works and later in similar capacity with the Department of Soldiers' Civil Reestablishment at Old Government House. Subsequently she was located in Saint John having a position in the General Public Hospital.

COLLECTIONS IN TAXES EXCEED PREVIOUS TOTAL

The City Treasurer An- nounces Record of \$208,690.50 Under Dis- count Period—Spread Over Long Time.

As was announced last week the collections of city taxes during the discount period exceeded all previous collections and established a record. Today C. F. Chestnut, City Treasurer, announced the figures. The total was \$208,690.50 up to Thursday night last when the period closed. The biggest day's collections were \$56,898.46 on the day before the last. The last day's collections totalled \$49,967.19.

Collections Well Spread Out

Mr. Chestnut says that the collections this year differed from previous years in the fact that the payments were spread out over a considerable length of time and there was no grand rush in the closing hours of the period. For that reason the best day's total did not make a record. The largest day's total of some \$57,000 is away below the record day's collection of 1925 which was \$68,455. In 1924 also there was a larger day's collection amount to \$61,215.64.

Money is Available

The total indicates that despite cries of hard times and depression there is money in this city for purposes such as tax-payment. It also is shown that more people than before are desirous of securing the discount.

To Collect the Balance

The Finance Department of the City now will proceed to square away for the collection of the balance of the 1926 taxes which is unpaid. If the rate-payers who owe for taxes do not pay voluntarily the usual methods of collection will be adopted.
