DIOCESAN SYNOD OPENS
ANNUAL SESSION HERE
ON TUESDAY MORNING

Charge of His Lordship the Bishop in Morning—
Business Session in Memorial Hall—Service for
Clergy at Cathedral—Laymen's Meeting at
Parish Hall Wednesday Night.

The annual meeting of the Diocesan Synod of the Anglican Synod of Fredericton will open here Tuesday morning continuing until Friday. The Synod meets at Saint John and Fredericton in alternate years. The business sessions of the Synod will be held in the Cathedral Memorial Hall, Church street, and the services in the Cathedral. On Wednesday there will be a meeting for laymen in the Parish Hall, Westmorland street, at which will be heard some of the men prominent in movements among the laymen. The charge of His Lordship Bishop Richards will be delivered Tuesday morning.

Many Delegates.

There will be many delegates from outside points to attend the Synod. Upwards of seventy members of the clergy, many with their wives, will be in attendance. The delegates from the laity will be somewhat more numerous.

Prominent among the members of the clergy attending will be His Lordship the Bishop of Nova Scotia and Rev. Dr. Arthur H. Moore, president of King's College, Halifax, who will speak before the Synod.
