Of Interest to the Women

SHADES OF GREEN
LEAD FOR SPRING.

Hues Range From Pale Nile to Dark Moss.

Green is by far the most popular of the new midwinter hat shades. All shades of green are being worn from a very pale Nile to brilliant peacock and dark moss. At Palm Beach a shade known as "peppermint" green is most popular for both dresses and bonnets.

Of course, one still sees soft, pliable felts which have become almost a staple millinery asset. They are adaptable to the present short haired mode and will doubtless remain in existence for some time to come.

The new notes in millinery are color and shape since materials do not alter. As to color when one says "green" the smartest of the new colors is mentioned with black, coral, pale shades of rose and certain greenish yellows following in demand. Shapes of the Beret type and shapes with the new Gigolo crown are each pressing into prominence.

Let one doesn't know the Beret, it is the snug little tam shape which is worn slightly over the eye and folded high at the rear. Usually there is a bandeau about the head and a tam shaped crown made of pliable felt or other soft material. The Gigolo crown, which is high, is draped to suit the face of the wearer. Nothing is smarter than a well draped crown on a small brimmed bonnet these days. Such shapes are particularly smart on the matron as there is considerable dignity expressed in the clever crown manipulation. The Beret shape on the other hand is far more suited to youthfulness.

CRANBERRY TART.

2 cups stewed cranberries, sweetened to taste or canned cranberry jelly.
1 1/2 cups flour
1/4 cup shortening
1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
2 teaspoons butter
Pinch of salt

Sift the flour and baking powder into bowl; add the shortening and rub in lightly; add just enough cold water to hold together; put into bowl in cold place for 3 or 4 hours, then roll out very thin. Put the butter in in small pieces, and double the dough; roll out again. Line 7-inch tin plate with the dough and fill with the cranberries. The remainder of the dough is rolled out, cut in very narrow strips and placed criss-cross over the tart. Brush the strips with milk. Bake 25 minutes in hot oven.

P. S.—This is very attractive if made in individual plates and topped with marshmallow whip.

LEMON MERINGUE PIE.

3 tablespoons lemon juice
1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
1 cup sugar
Pinch of salt
2 cups water
2 eggs
1 tablespoon butter
3 tablespoons cornstarch
3 tablespoons marshmallow whip

A MILLION IS JUST A DROP IN THE BUCKET

He is a Republican. "President Coolidge and Gov. Smith are two remarkable men. They don't grow tired very often," he said.

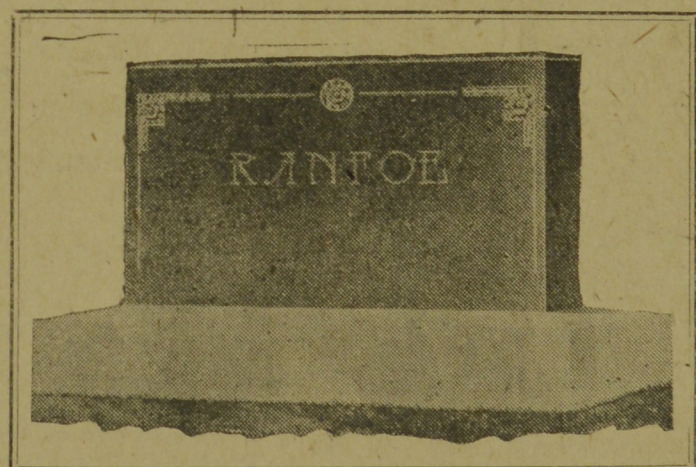
