#### A VALUABLE ANIMAL.

After a most exhaustive examinalion of the muskrat breeding grounds of the Saskatchewan river basin, north of the 53rd parallel of latitude, during the last few months, fur experts in Northern Manitoba predict that easily 90,000 muskrats will be season of 1926. This will be approximately three times the number taken by the trappers last spring, which was about 30,000. The relative net increase 200 per cent. over the spring of 1925, which season showed a 100 per cent. increase over that of 11924. The closed season for trapping muskrat during each fall of the past few years is said to be entirely responsible for
