

### CONFERENCE OF FORD DEALERS HERE TODAY

#### Departmental Heads Also Here—Business of 1926 in District Has Been Very Gratifying.

The Ford Managers of this district of New Brunswick are in conference here today. The purpose is to go over the business of 1926 and prepare plans for 1927. In addition to the heads of departments dealers are here from the Saint John Valley and other districts in this part of New Brunswick. This is the first conference of the kind as formerly Maritime conferences were held. On Friday there will be a similar conference at Moncton and on the following Tuesday one at Halifax for the south shore of Nova Scotia.

The localities represented here today are Edmundston, Grand Falls, Perth, Woodstock, St. Stephen, Chipman, Fredericton and Saint John. The gathering took place at the Barker House where those present after a preliminary partook of luncheon. Other conferences followed and will not be completed until ten o'clock tonight.

### CAPITAL OF LUMBER COMPANY IS DOUBLED

#### The Nephew of John D. Rockefeller, in Fish & Game Club—Local Jewellery Business Incorporated.

The capital stock of The Bonny River Lumber Company Limited has been increased from \$75,000 to \$150,000 by supplementary letters patent. The total stock issue is to be divided into twelve hundred shares of common stock and seven hundred and fifty shares of preference stock with seven per cent dividend.

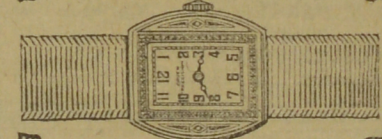
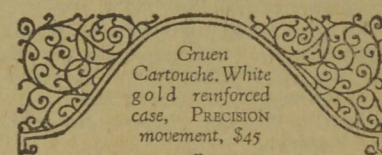

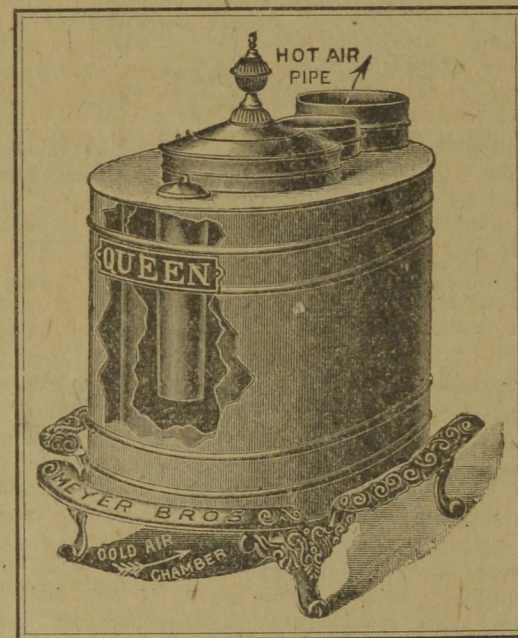
