

REPAIRS TO STERLING UNIT BEING MADE

Parts Arrived Yesterday — Ald. Mitchell Talks About the Poor Pressure at Fire Tuesday Morning.

The new cylinders for the Sterling gasoline-engine pumping unit at the waterworks arrived yesterday and their installation in place of the cracked cylinders discovered at the first test was made today. Ald. Mitchell, chairman of the Water Committee, said at noon today that the repairs were expected to be completed by tonight.

Ald. Mitchell when asked concerning the alleged weak fire-pressure during the fire in University Avenue Tuesday morning, said that he believed that failure to start the electric pumps in series was what made the trouble. When it was corrected the pressure was satisfactory. Mr. Laing, said Ald. Mitchell went to the pumping station and made the adjustment at once.

Ald. Mitchell said also that instructions were to be given to the members of the pumping station staff in the operation of the new plant, the representatives of the Canadian Fairbanks Morse Limited, including Mr. Laing, being the instructors. Chief Engineer John Malloy already had been instructed.

With regard to the distribution system in University Avenue, Ald. Mitchell said he believed that a four-inch main existed there and that would do much toward reducing pressure if two fire-streams were taken off.

Ten Resolutions Passed by Executive — Fredericton Branch to be Formed — Non-political Administration.

The executive of the New Brunswick Fish and Game Protective Association met at the Queen Hotel this morning and prepared a number of resolutions relating to the Game Act for presentation this afternoon to the Minister of Lands and Mines, Hon. C. D. Richards.

The meeting represented by delegates branches at St. Stephen, St. Andrew's, McAdam, Perth, Woodstock Saint John and Fredericton. On Friday night the Fredericton Branch is to be organized.

A number of guides were present also.

Delegates Present.

Delegates in attendance were: St. John, Allan G. McAvity, President; Francis Kerr, Secretary; D. King Hazen, George Gaynor; Carleton County, P. S. Marsten, M. Mackenzie; McAdam, G. C. McCrumb; Victoria County, Claude Knapp, A. H. Baird Charles Cremin.

St. Andrew's Approves.

The Resolutions.

The resolutions, adopted and presented to Hon. Mr. Richards this afternoon were as follows:—

1. That a Game Commission of non-political business men be appointed to administer the Game Act and to employ men selected on merit only at a living wage and to have control of regulations.
2. That the appointment of Game Wardens be taken out of politics and that wardens be appointed on a basis of experience and ability, moreover that the number of wardens be reduced and higher wages be paid to competent employees.
3. That more game-refuges be established.
4. That the sale of big game, game birds and trout be prohibited.
5. That moose be protected until their heads contain ten points.
