PROHIBITION, SMUGGLING AND RUM RUNNING

To the Editor of The Daily Mail,

Fredericton, N. B.

Dear Sir:—

In your Editorial in Tuesday's Mail you quote a press notice of the capture of a Rum Runner with \$5,000 of liquor by the Border guard of Pembina, and you say that it is being used as an argument against Government Control. Apparently the intention of the Mail is to use it to discredit Prohibition. You say that under Government Control in Manitoba those engaged in Rum Running are frequently caught and fined. Does the Editor mean to say that the Pembina County Border guards success in capturing these Rum Runners is due to Government Control in Manitoba? The facts suggest that Government Control in Manitoba provides facilities for rum running into a Prohibition State that ought not to be allowed, and that alert officers of that State successfully prevented their doing it.

The editorial goes on to say that very little effort is being put forth to prevent smuggling in the Provinces under Prohibition, and to curb the operations of those engaged in playing the game. Judging by the published reports from Quebec where they have Government Control the law against smuggling is not any better enforced than in this Province. That Prohibition has to do with the gross neglect of the Dominion Government to enforce the Customs law in this Province it is not easy to see. If what the Editor believes to be true, what he says, then as a good citizen he ought to get after the Dominion Government, so steadily supported by him, and as far as his influence may go see that it does its duty in stopping the notorious smuggling into and out of this Province and in that way helping to give our Prohibition Law a better chance for success.

(If our rev friend is anxious to put a stop to liquor smuggling and its attendant evil, rum running, we would suggest that he have the Temperance Alliance recommend the Federal Government to reduce the duty on imported liquors. Such a recommendation would undoubtedly carry far more weight with the authorities at Ottawa than any suggestion this humble journal of the home might have to offer. It is only the high duty of \$20 per case on cheap Scotch whiskey that makes smuggling and rum running a big money making proposition and so long as it continues as such the prohibitory law in this province cannot be successfully enforced.)

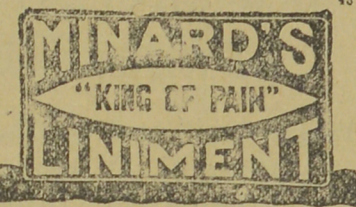
