### A MASTER FARMER.

Twenty studious, hard working men of high ideals, residents in Ohio, have taken a new degree—M. F. It means Master Farmer.

The degrees were not conferred by any institution of higher education, but by a reputable and well established farm periodical, after painstaking investigation. The investigators took into account farm methods and farm results, the field management and the home management, the aims and ideals of the farmers and their community service. Neither the farmer's age nor his acreage counted. There are young men and old men among the degree winners and their farms range in area from fifty acres to more than eight hundred.

The breeding of the best cattle by some, of the best hogs by others, the production of the best fruits and of the best corn were factors in the awards, and rightly so, but of one of the winners it was said. "His four boys and two girls and their twenty-four children are working for better dairy cattle and better rural communities."

This Master Farmer knows how to get results himself. More important, he knows how to inspire others.

### NOT AFTER MONEY.

Beyond question George Bernard Shaw is one of the world's most interesting living men. A master among masters in the art of writing, he adds to the distinction a talent for talking. Possessing an appealing sense of humor and a daring manner of saying things, his interviews give the reader a desire to cuss which ends in a laugh.

Mr. Shaw has had the honor of winning the Nobel prize for literature for 1925. He doesn't know why—can't remember having done anything. The money that goes with the honor amounts to more than \$30,000. This he rejects. Take back your gold, said the lady in the old melodrama.

The author explains that his readers and his audiences provide him with more than sufficient moneys for his needs. "And as to my renown," he says, "it is greater than is good for my spiritual health." And again: "Under these circumstances money is a life-belt thrown to a swimmer who has already reached the shore in safety."

This man's way of doing things different from the way other men would do them, and not doing things other men do, has given him an eminent distinction among geniuses.

### PUBLIC TASTER.

Don't think the world is going wrong. There are hopeful signs. Jesse Lasky, great capitalist of the moving pictures, says humor has replaced love and problem plays in popularity on the screen. With the love of humor is a growing interest in clean action pictures of adventure. Mr. Lasky says:

"A canvass of public tastes and desires in seventy-two countries, and a check of the various pictures released last year indicate also that the film public has distinct liking for stories unfolding interesting details of human activities, such as those revolving about the lumber industry, the forest ranger service, the coast guard, the merchant marine, the automobile business and similar lines with colorful backgrounds."

Premier Mackenzie King, who recently had conferred upon him the freedom of the city of Edinburgh, speaking on that occasion, laid special emphasis on the fact that throughout the years the relationship of Scotland and Canada had been very near. He spoke of Abraham Martin, the Scottish pilot with Samuel DeChamplain, French explorer, colonial pioneer and first governor of French Canada, whose name is remembered in the Plains of Abraham, Quebec. He related a story of the first white woman in Western Canada who came from Scotland. In all parts of Canada, the Premier said Scotsmen had been pioneers in the development of the country and leaders in all kinds of activity.

The Ferguson government is expected to make a sweep of the cities on its liquor policy, but may lose some of the rural constituencies, where temperance sentiment is more pronounced. In the last House the Government had 76 supporters.

Politics in Ontario appears to be somewhat mixed at the present time. Sir George Foster, a Conservative Senator, is opposing the Ferguson government, while another knight, Sir Allan Aylesworth, a Liberal Senator, is supporting it. Other knights including Sir John Aird, Sir Thomas White and Sir Joseph Flavelle are strong for Premier Ferguson.

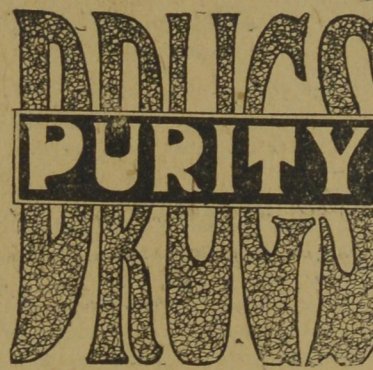
