

MOTOR CAMPS AROUND IN THE WHITE MOUNTAINS

Jackson, N. H., Aug. 24—"Looks like rain; guess we'd better head for a camp ground."

It's a frequent remark up here in the heart of the White mountains where an innocent looking little cloud develops into a downpour of rain with almost incredible speed.

Shelter Near.

And the tourist seldom has far to go to find a place to pitch his waterproof tent or find shelter in a tiny cabin. With the development of motor travel on the highways through the mountain notches in the last few years public and private camping places have sprung up at short intervals.

Hotels are abundant in the summer resort centres, but there are thousands of motorists who rarely visit them. They prefer the adventure of summer nights under canvas, and camp-cooked meals. With many, too, the item of expense is important.

These camp grounds are democratic places. Limousines and flivvers are parked side by side. Everything is informal. The man in immaculate white flannels chats with his neighbor in stained khaki without even glancing at his clothes. Blouse and knickers are the favorite costume with the women campers. The millionaire looking for a brief release from social obligations awaits his turn for a chance to wash up at the solitary camp faucet with the clerk or mechanic who is giving himself the treat of a mountain vacation.

Many Fireplaces.

Each tent is pitched beside a rough board table, with long boards for seats. Many of the camps have stone or brick fireplaces, but these are used mostly for the "friendship fire," about which the campers may gather and smoke and tell stories in the evening. Most of the motor tourists cook their meals on gasoline stoves which they set up beside the tables. The commercial camp invariably has attached its

combination food shop, restaurant and gasoline station and some of the campers prefer to have their meals on its screened porch. Others find it a convenient place to replenish their stock of provisions.

The site chosen is a broad field adjoining one of the well traveled state highways. In many cases a river runs along the other side of the field and there is a chance for a dip and a short swim. Drinking water comes from a cold mountain spring and water for other purposes is piped from a brook. State supervision insures sanitary conditions. For those who have not brought tents little wooden cabins are available, each just big enough to contain a bed and a couple of chairs.

Since the White mountain national forest was established a number of public camping places have been provided within its limits, some near the highways and some deep in the heart of the forest along a mountain trail. The state maintains a camping field on its reservation in Crawford Notch. For the hikers over the trails and Appalachian Mountain Club has its well equipped stone huts and its open-faced shelters, most of them far up on the mountain heights.

Climb Mountains.

The man who is touring the mountains on foot with blanket and pack and fishing rod often finds the camp cabin a comfortable change on a rainy night from the bed of fir or spruce boughs in the open which usually is his delight.

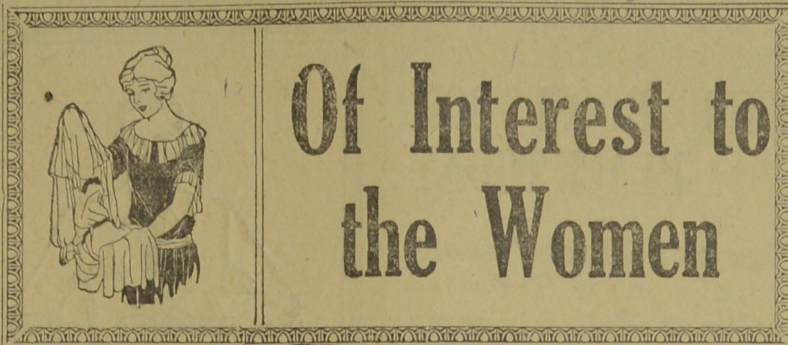

Earrings grow longer and more interesting. They have ceased to be a fad and are worn with greater discrimination and hence more distinction than ever before.

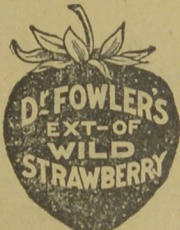
SOUR CUCUMBER PICKLES.

For these pickles select plump cucumbers about three inches long and of uniform size. Wash and scrub the cucumbers with a small stiff brush, arrange them in an earthen jar and pour over them a brine made of salt and cold water in the proportions of one generous cup of coarse salt to each gallon of water. Cover and let stand over night. In the morning drain and rinse in fresh cold water, rinse the crock in which they were soaked and return the pickles to the crock. Dissolve one tablespoon of crushed alum in one cup of boiling water, add to it one quart each of pickling vinegar and cold water. Pour over the prepared pickles, cover and let stand twenty-four hours. Drain and pack the pickles into half gallon sterilized glass jars add three or four small red pepper pods to each jar and a few cubes of horseradish root, a few bits of bay leaves, also a sprinkling of whole spices (use cloves with discretion as they darken the pickles). Cover with the best bottled white pickling vinegar. Seal the fruit jars as in canning fruit. Invert the jars, let stand to see if there are leaks. Store in a cool dark place these pickles will keep crisp a year and will be ready for use in less than a week.

SWEET CUCUMBER PICKLES.

Proceed as for sour cucumber pickles. Drain the pickles from the dilute vinegar, wipe each pickle and pack them into sterilized half gallon glass jars. Pour over the following mixture filling jars to overflowing: To each pint of pure cider vinegar add one cup of water, sugar to sweeten to taste (about two pounds). To each jar add one half tablespoon each of white and black mustard seed, and to the vinegar and sugar add one half cup of horseradish root cut in small cubes, one cup of small white pickling onions, one tablespoon whole cloves, two tablespoons of bits of stick cinnamon, three small bay leaves broken into bits twenty four blades of mace, and to each jar add three or four small red peppers. Bring this mixture to the boiling point, stirring constantly until the sugar is dissolved and the onions are parboiled. To divide evenly between the jars skim them out and put an equal number into each jar. Then pour the remaining mixture over the pickles filling the jars full. Seal as canned fruit invert the jars, and when cold store in a cool dark place.

ASPARAGUS LOAF SALAD.

2 tablespoons butter
3 tablespoons flour
4 eggs
2½ tablespoons gelatin
Juice of 1 lemon
1 can asparagus tips
1 pint whipped cream
Paprika and pepper
Melt butter in double boiler, add flour, asparagus liquor and cook until thick. Cover and cook ten minutes. Beat eggs very light, pour hot mixture over them and return to double boiler and cook until thick like custard. Remove from fire and add gelatin which has been previously dissolved in cold water. Dissolve thoroughly. Cool and add whipped cream and asparagus tips. Put in cold wet mould until hard. Slice and serve on lettuce with mayonnaise. Serves six.

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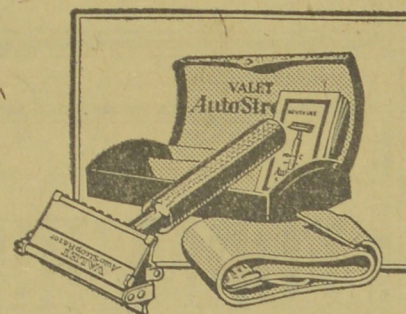
