

MEDUCTIC HYDRO
DEVELOPMENT IS
ATTRACTIVE

People of Fredericton and Vicinity Greatly Interested — Recent Report Concerned in the Matter.

The announcement made by Hon. E. A. Reilly, chairman of the New Brunswick Power Commission, following the meeting of the commission here on Tuesday in conjunction with the Provincial Government meeting, to the effect that possibilities of power development at Meductic Rapids on the Saint John River would be investigated, has been received with pleasure and interest by the people of Fredericton and vicinity. The fact that decision was reached almost the same time that the Weston-Stephens report was presented to the City Council adds to the interest as that report named Meductic as the best hydro proposition within easy reach of Fredericton while at the same time making suggestions for temporary accommodation until development should be made.

Consideration of that report by members of the Council will take place now with the investigation by the Commission's engineers in view.

Immediate Action Expected
From what was said by members of the Commission and others who were here yesterday the expectation is that action toward investigation will be taken by the staff of the Commission as soon as possible which will be the present autumn. It is expected that engineers will be on the ground at an early date.

Market for Power

The objection mentioned in the Weston-Stephens report that there must be some industry of sufficient size to use a large block of power to justify, is met by the application of interests on the Miramichi for power from Meductic. There also is a report current that interests distinct from any engaged at present in pulp and paper manufacture in New Brunswick contemplate the establishment of an industry on the Saint John River in the vicinity of Fredericton. Transfer of the lands of the New Brunswick Railway Company would be necessary for the establishment of such an industry.

FAILED IN
APPEAL TO THE

LITTLE CHANGE
IN COLLEGE SPORT
SITUATION

Acadia Stays Out—Dalhousie in Western Section for Hockey Provisionally — U. N. B. Delegate Returns.

The Maritime Intercollegiate Athletic Conference which took place at Truro on Tuesday and which is of interest here because of the membership of the University of New Brunswick in the conference, resulted in little change in matters. Acadia still remains outside the conference. That college applied for admission to the Eastern Section for hockey but was refused admission. St. Francis Xavier, King's and Nova Scotia Tech considering that the section had better remain as it is. Dalhousie applied for admission to the Western Section for hockey and was admitted provisionally the final acceptance depends upon the opinion of the student bodies of Mt. Allison and University of New Brunswick the present members of the section.

In other sports the Eastern Section remains as it has been. Mr. Allison and U. N. B. remain as the Western Section. They are to arrange for the decision as to which team will represent the Western Section in the playoff with Eastern Section winners. It is probable that home-and-home games will be played for the purpose.

Too great expense in playing Mt. Allison and U. N. B. is the reason assigned by Acadia for withdrawal from the Western Section.

W. W. Donohoe captain of the U. N. B. rugby team who was student delegate to the conference returned home this morning. Prof. H. P. Webb was faculty representative.

There is general regret among alumni of the colleges in the original Western Section that the section could not remain as it was.

No Nomination Made With Parish Clerk for Byelection Next Tuesday — Situation Unprovided for.


Municipal honors are lightly considered in the Parish of New Maryland or else the people are forgetful for the period for receiving nominations. Frank Smith resigned as councillor after leaving the parish thus creating the vacancy. For some time past Coun. William Kirk has been the sole representative.

Situation Not Provided For.
The situation is one not provided for by existing laws. Evidently the makers of the laws did not conceive of any parish being so little interested that a candidate would not be in the field and County Secretary J. S. Scott does not know what the next step will be.

Cannot Nominate After Date.
Six days must elapse between the last day for receiving nominations and the day of election. In the Parish of North Lake that point arose some time ago when George Gould filed his papers the morning after the last day for nominations and they were refused by the Parish Clerk and he was not permitted to be a candidate. That means that between now and election day, Tuesday no nomination can be made. The only remedy seems to be to set another date for the byelection and wait for one nomination or more.
